“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section VI, Schedule V to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd

January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, the payment of Command Money to Flag Captains at the rate of 7s. a day:

“And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 14th day of May, 1934, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, the payment of Command Money to the Flag Captain to the Commander-in-Chief, China, at the rate of 10s. a day for the whole of every period during which the Commander-in-Chief may be absent from the Flag Ship for more than nine days, provided that the ship commanded by the Flag Captain is one which apart from the appointment of Flag Ship would carry this rate when in full commission:

“And whereas we consider that there is no longer any justification for the payment to a Flag Captain of a rate of Command Money lower than that appropriate to his ship, if not employed as a Flag Ship:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to cancel the provisions of Orders in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and the 14th day of May, 1934, in so far as they relate to the payment of Command Money to Flag Captains and the Flag Captain to the Commander-in-Chief, China, respectively, and to sanction with effect from the 30th day of October, 1935, the payment to all Flag Captains of Command Money at the rates normally applicable to the ships commanded by them.

WHEREAS by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may make such Orders in Council and do such things as appear to him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty of Peace signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and for giving effect to any of the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1935, the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, and the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 3) Order, 1935, for the purpose of carrying out the said Treaty and giving effect to the Covenant of the League of Nations contained in Part I thereof:

And whereas for the purpose aforesaid it is expedient to make such further provision as is hereinafter contained;

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Reduction of duty on certain Yugoslav goods.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the Import Duties Act, 1932, or any order for the time being in force made (whether before or after the date of this Order) under the said Act, any additional duty chargeable under the said Act on dead domestic poultry shall not be charged on any such poultry being fowls (other than guinea fowls) or turkeys produced in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia and imported into the United Kingdom on or after the twenty-fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, accompanied by a quota certificate.

(2) There shall be charged on dead domestic poultry, being such fowls or turkeys as aforesaid, in lieu of the general ad valorem duty, a duty of one penny per pound weight, and references in any enactment to the general ad valorem duty or to duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1932, or under Part I thereof, shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be deemed to include, in relation to such poultry, a reference to the duty chargeable under this paragraph.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the Ottawa Agreements Act, 1932, or the Import Duties Act, 1932, no customs duty shall be chargeable under either of those Acts on eggs in shell produced in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia and imported into the United Kingdom on or after the twenty-fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, accompanied by a quota certificate.

(4) In this Article the expression “quota certificate” in relation to goods of any description means a certificate issued, in such form and containing such particulars as the

Board of Trade may direct, by a person approved for the purpose by the Board of Trade, certifying that the goods form part of the quantity of goods of that description which may be imported by virtue of this Article free of additional duty or free of duty, as the case may be, and that the goods were produced in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia, but—

(a) the quantity of turkeys in respect of which such certificates are issued shall not exceed sixty thousand hundredweights in any period of twelve months, or thirty thousand hundredweights in the period commencing on the date of this Order and ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-six; and

(b) the quantity of fowls or eggs in shell in respect of which such certificates are issued shall not exceed twenty thousand hundredweights in any period of twelve months or three thousand hundredweights in any month.

(5) This Article shall be deemed to be an Act relating to the Customs within the meaning of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and shall be construed as one with that Act, so, however, that in this Article the expression "the United Kingdom" shall not include the Isle of Man.

(6) In this Article references to any enactment shall be construed as references to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.

Provision as to bacon produced in Yugoslavia.

2. If and so long as any order for the time being in force made (whether before or after the date of this Order) under section one of the Agricultural Marketing Act, 1933, contains provisions—

(a) that it shall not be lawful to import into the United Kingdom, except under licence, bacon produced in any foreign country in respect of which a declaration made by the Board of Trade under the order has come into force; and

(b) that such a declaration shall or may be made if the rate of importation into the United Kingdom of bacon produced in any foreign country exceeds such rate as is specified in the order;

the provisions aforesaid shall have effect, as respects bacon produced in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia, as if for the rate of importation so specified there were substituted the rate of six hundred and twenty-five hundredweights per week.

Short title and interpretation.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 4) Order, 1935.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as amended by any subsequent enactment, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and doth hereby declare that the Safety Convention has been applied to the Italian Colonies of Libya, Eritrea and Somaliland and to the Italian islands of the Aegean.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the first day of November, 1928, and entitled The West African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1928 (in this Order referred to as the Principal Order), a Court, called the West African Court of Appeal (in this Order referred to as the Court of Appeal), was constituted for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Supreme Courts of the Colonies of

the Gold Coast, Sierra Leone and the Gambia, and from His Majesty's Chief Commissioner's Court of Ashanti, and from His Majesty's Courts in the territories of West Africa known as the Protectorates of Sierra Leone and the Gambia, and the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast, and Togoland under British Mandate:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of January, 1930, and entitled the West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930, the Principal Order was amended in certain respects:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of February, 1934, and entitled the West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1934, the Principal Order was further amended by making further and better provision than that theretofore in force for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Supreme Court of Nigeria and by making provision for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's High Court of the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 4th day of May, 1935, and entitled the West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1935, the Principal Order was further amended by making provision for the hearing of appeals from the Supreme Court of the Gold Coast and from other Courts of the Gold Coast:

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order should be further amended as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, and the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Article 2 of the Principal Order is hereby amended (a) by inserting the word "and" between "Chief Justice" and "Judge", and (b) by deleting the words "Chief Registrar", "Master and Registrar", and "Clerk of Courts."

2. Article 5 of the Principal Order is hereby amended (a) by deleting paragraph (1) thereof, and (b) by deleting the number "(2)" in paragraph (2) thereof.

3. Article 6 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the following Article substituted therefor:—

"6. The Presidency and the seniority of the Members of the Court of Appeal shall be determined according to instructions to be given from time to time by the Secretary of State."

4. Article 12 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by deleting in paragraph (1) thereof the words "the President and the Chief Justice of Nigeria" and by substituting therefor the words "the Chief Justice of Nigeria and the Chief Justice of the Gold Coast or such other Judges of the Court of Appeal as the Secretary of State may from time to time direct".

5.—(1) This Order may be cited as "The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council (No. 2) 1935".

(2) The Principal Order, The West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930, The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1934, The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1935, and this Order may be cited together as The West African Court of Appeal Orders in Council, 1928-1935.

(3) A copy of the Principal Order with the amendments whether by way of addition, omission, or substitution required by The West African Court of Appeal (Amendment) Order in Council, 1930, The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1934, The West African Court of Appeal (Further Amendment) Order in Council, 1935, and this Order, and entitled "The West African Court of Appeal Orders in Council, 1928-1935, Consolidated", shall be prepared and certified by the Secretary of State, and copies of The West African Court of Appeal Orders in Council, 1928-1935, Consolidated, shall be printed in accordance with the copy so certified, containing the certificate of the Secretary of State as aforesaid printed at the heading thereof, which certificate shall recite the provisions of this and the preceding paragraphs of this Article, and such copies may thereafter be exclusively referred to for all purposes connected with the West African Court of Appeal.

6. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 26th day of November, 1880, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty was amended by a Convention signed on the 29th day of June, 1904:

And whereas the said Treaty and Convention were duly ratified:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Convention signed on the 19th day of December, 1934, between His Majesty and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the terms whereof were recited in the Switzerland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935, and are as follows:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the Swiss Federal Council, desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Howard Kennard, His Majesty's Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Switzerland;

The Swiss Federal Council:

M. Giuseppe Motta, Federal Counsellor, Chief of the Federal Political Department;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention, Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Berne on the 26th November, 1880, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

“Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made.”

Article 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Berne. From the date that such notice comes into effect the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and the territory of the member of the Commonwealth concerned on the other hand.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any member

of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the member concerned.

Article 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

Article 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880.

In faith whereof the above-named Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and French at Berne the nineteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-four.

His Majesty The King has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Victoria Cross to the undermentioned officer:—

The late Captain Godfrey Meynell, M.C., 5th Battalion (Queen Victoria's Own Corps of Guides), 12th Frontier Force Regiment, Indian Army.

For most conspicuous gallantry and extreme devotion to duty.

On the 29th September, 1935, while operating against Mohmand tribesmen in the attack on Point 4080, Captain Meynell was Adjutant of the Battalion. In the final phase of the attack, the Battalion Commander was unable to get information from his most forward troops. Captain Meynell went forward to ascertain the situation and found the forward troops on the objective, but involved in a struggle against an enemy vastly superior in numbers. Seeing the situation he at once took over command of the men in this area. The enemy, by this time, was closing in on the position from three sides.

Captain Meynell had at his disposal two Lewis guns and about thirty men. Although this party was maintaining heavy and accurate fire on the advancing enemy, the overwhelming numbers of the latter succeeded in reaching the position. Both the Lewis guns were damaged beyond repair and a fierce hand to hand struggle commenced.

During the struggle Captain Meynell was mortally wounded and all his men were either killed or wounded.

Throughout the action Captain Meynell endeavoured by all means to communicate the situation to Headquarters, but determined to

hold on at all costs and encouraged his men to fight with him to the last.

By so doing he inflicted on the enemy very heavy casualties which prevented them from exploiting their success.

The fine example Captain Meynell set to his men, coupled with his determination to hold the position to the last, maintain the traditions of the Army and reflect the highest credit on the fallen officer and his comrades.
