Civil Service Commission, January 21, 1936.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE NORMAL RECRUITMENT BY OPEN COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT ENGINEERS (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. It is anticipated that competitions, when required, will normally be held annually in the spring of the year.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the 1st March of the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candidate may deduct any time, up to a maximum of two years, which he has spent in an approved works or in post-graduate research work in an approved laboratory; and candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

Assistant Traffic Superintendents in the Post Office who are otherwise eligible, or who after three years' approved service in the Traffic Branch receive a nomination by the Engineer-in-Chief, may be granted an extension of age in respect of the period of their employment on traffic work in the Post Office, up to a maximum of five years, inclusive of any extension claimed for time spent in an approved engineering works.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as
