Whitehall, January 21, 1936.

On Monday night the twentieth of January instant, at five minutes to twelve o'clock, our late Most Gracious Sovereign King George the Fifth expired at Sandringham in the seventy-first year of His age, and the twenty-sixth of His Reign. This event has caused one universal feeling of regret and sorrow to His late Majesty's faithful and attached Subjects, to whom He was endeared by the deep interest in their welfare which He invariably manifested, as well as by the eminent and impressive virtues which illustrated and adorned His character.

Upon the intimation of this distressing event the Lords of the Privy Council assembled this day at St. James's Palace, and gave orders for proclaiming His present Majesty, Who made a most Gracious Declaration to them.

Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God to call to His Mercy our late Sovereign Lord King George the Fifth, of Blessed and Glorious Memory, by whose Decease the Imperial Crown of Great Britain, Ireland and all other His late Majesty's Dominions is solely and rightfully come to the High and Mighty Prince Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David; We, therefore, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm, being here assisted with these of His late Majesty's Privy Council, with Numbers of

other Principal Gentlemen of Quality, with the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of London, do now hereby with one Voice and Consent of Tongue and Heart, publish and proclaim, That the High and Mighty Prince Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign of happy Memory, become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord Edward the Eighth, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To whom we do acknowledge all Faith and constant Obedience, with all hearty and humble Affection; beseeching God, by whom Kings and Queens do reign, to bless the Royal Prince Edward the Eighth with long and happy Years to reign over us.

Given at St. James's Palace this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty being this day present in Council was pleased to make the following Declaration:—
 Your Royal Highnesses, My Lords, and Gentlemen.

The irreparable loss which the British Commonwealth of Nations has sustained by the death of His Majesty My beloved Father, has devolved upon Me the duty of Sovereignty. I know how much you and all My Subjects, with I hope I may say the whole world, feel for Me in My sorrow and I am confident in the affectionate sympathy which will be extended to My dear Mother in Her overpowering grief.

When My Father stood here twenty-six years ago He declared that one of the objects of His life would be to uphold constitutional government. In this I am determined to

follow in My Father's footsteps and to work as He did throughout His life for the happiness and welfare of all classes of My Subjects.

I place My reliance upon the loyalty and affection of My peoples throughout the Empire, and upon the wisdom of their Parliaments, to support Me in this heavy task, and I pray that God will guide Me to perform it.

Whereupon the Lords of the Council made it their humble request to His Majesty that His Majesty's Most Gracious Declaration to Their Lordships might be made public; which His Majesty was pleased to order accordingly.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 31st January, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-19, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd February, 1936, to Saturday, the 8th February, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF UNESTABLISHED DRAUGHTSMAN IN THE SURVEY SECTION OF THE TITHE BRANCH OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Competitions under these Regulations are open both to male and female candidates. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 23; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination.

A candidate who attained the age of 19 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 23 on that day would not be admitted.

The following exceptions to the above age limits are allowed:—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. as to the position of meters and as to the inspection and testing thereof; relieving the Corporation from obligation to supply gas under certain circumstances; provisions as to the application of proceeds of sale and hire of fittings and as to the recovery of sums due for fittings and other apparatus; empowering the Corporation to cut off supplies of gas where their charges are not wholly paid; authorising special charges for special readings of meters; and empowering the Corporation to contract for the supply and purchase of gas in bulk.

4. To make further provision with regard to the sale, letting for hire, fixing, repairing and removal of gas fittings by the Corporation; to authorise the Corporation to carry out such sale, letting, fixing, repairing and removal themselves; and to repeal so much of section 23 of the Chelmsford Corporation Gas Act, 1915, as would prevent them from so doing or would require the work in connection therewith to be carried out by contractors.

5. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for the general purposes of their gas undertaking and for the payment of the costs and expenses of and connected with the Order and to make other financial provisions, including provisions for authorising the use of money forming part of sinking and reserve funds instead of borrowing; to enact provisions with regard to the receipts and expenses of the gas undertaking and to require all such receipts and expenses to be carried to, or paid out of, the general rate fund; to enact further provisions as to accounts in connection with the gas undertaking, the application of the revenue of that undertaking and the establishment of reserve funds.

6. To authorise the Corporation to take licences for the use of patents; to make further provisions as to the service of gas demand notes; and to enable several sums to be included in one summons.

7. To enable the Corporation to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for giving effect to the purposes of the Order and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas;

8. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights, powers and privileges;

9.
