At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 3rd day of March, 1936.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of February, 1936 (G.H.), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and recupiary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas by an Order in Council of
His late Majesty, bearing date the 26th June,

His late Majesty, bearing date the 26th June, 1933, a pension at the rate of £115 15s. 4d. a year was granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. H. T. Arnold, a former Master in the Royal Hospital School when at Greenwich:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Mr. Arnold is entitled to an addition to this pension in respect of the sums contributed by him towards a deferred annuity fund:

"And whereas the operation of the Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1935, should, in our

opinion, automatically increase as from 1st July, 1935, the above pension of £115 15s. 4d.:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of two further pensions to Mr. Arnold at the rate of Fifteen pounds eight shillings (£15 8s.) and Thirteen shillings and two pence (13s. 2d.) per annum as from the 2nd December, 1934 and the 1st July, 1935 respectively."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
