

Electoral Highness intends to return the next week. That Elector has published a Declaration, promising several Privileges to such as will come and Build Houses at *Manheym* and *Fredericksbourg*, which Places he designs to Fortifie. VVe have yet no Account of the Evacuation of *Brissac*.

*Dieren*, Sept. 19. The King came hither on the 16th instant from *Loe*. The next day His Majesty went to the Camp to see the last of the Troops march in. Yesterday His Majesty went thither again early in the morning, and was met at the Entrance of the Camp by the Prince of *Nassau Sarsbruck*, who Commands there in Chief; and by the Earl of *Atblome* General of the Horse, and the other Generals, and Principal Officers of the Army. His Majesty found the Troops drawn out in Two Lines, being 28 Battalions of Foot, and 31 Squadrons of Horse and Dragoons, and was very well satisfied with the good Condition they all appeared in. The General Review being over, all the Horse and Dragoons passed by His Majesty in single Troops. There was a great Concourse of the Nobility and Gentry of these Parts and from *Holland*; The French Ambassador, Count *Tallard*, was also there, and after the Review waited upon His Majesty hither. This morning His Majesty returned to the Camp again, to see the Foot likewise pass by in single Companies; And to morrow the Forces will begin to File off towards their respective Garisons, and His Majesty designs to return to *Loe*. 'Tis said, His Majesty will begin his Journey to *Cell* about the 30th of this month.

*Hague*, Septemb. 19. The Baron *d'Obrezinsky*, Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenbourg*, who came some days ago from *Loe*, is gone for *Berlin*, but will return hither in a short time. The Count *d'Attergne* is also come to this place from *Loe*. The Baron of *Bloemberg*, Envoy from the Duke of *Courland*, designs to take his Audience of Leave of the *States General* to morrow, and in a few days to begin his Journey home. Monsieur *d'Odyke*, Ambassador Extraordinary from this State at the French Court, is expected back the next month; and Monsieur *Heemskerke*, his Colleague is to continue there.

*Paris*, Sept. 20. N. S. The Court continues at *Compeigne*, where the young Princes of *France* have been Entertained with several Representations of Sieges, Attacks, and Battles, The King intends on Wednesday next to return to *Versailles*; and the 3d of the next month he will go to *Fontainebleau*. The Equipages of Mademoiselle, Daughter to the Duke of *Orleans*, are preparing in order to her Marriage with the Duke of *Lorraine*. The 29th instant is the day fixed for passing the Contract, and the 30th for the Ceremony of the Marriage, and in 6 or 7 days after she will begin her Journey to *Lorraine*. The Duke *d'Esrees* Died some days ago, and is Succeeded by the Marquis *Cocurves*, his Eldest Son, as well in his Title and Estate as in the Governments of the Isle of *France*, the *Soissonois*, and the Cities and Citadels of *Laon*, *Noyon*, and *Soissons*. On Thursday last arrived here a Courier from *Madrid*; 'Tis said, He brings an Account, That the King of *Spain* was very ill when he came away.

*Portsmouth*, Sept. 13. On Saturday last, Vice-Admiral *Aylmer*, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, bound to the *Strights*, sailed from *Spithead*; but the *VVind* changing came to an Anchor at *St. Helens*, from whence he sailed again this morning.

*London*, Sept. 14. On the 12th instant was Launch'd at His Majesty's Yard at *VVoolwich*, a new 3d Rate Ship of 70 Guns, named the *Bedford*; and at *VVoodbridge*, a new 5th Rate Ship of 32 Guns, named the *Ludlow*, built by Mr. *Mundy* of that place.

And Information upon Oath being made before the Lord Chief Justice *Holt*, That one *Jam: Moor*, a well set man, aged about 30; And that one *Guffneg alias White*, a lusty tall man, aged about 50, of a swarthy Complexion, round shouldered, a little short neck, commonly wore a dark brown Wig, and a *Cinnamon colour'd Coat*; And one *Reymond Fitzmorris*, a thin man, wore a light coloured Wig, aged about 30, were 3 of the Persons that were concerned in the said Robbery, who have since absconded and are fled from Justice: These are therefore to give Notice, That their Excellencies the Lords Justices of England, have been pleased to Promise His Majesty's Gracious Pardon to any one of the said Persons, or any other Person concerned, as shall first make a full and ample Discovery of the said Robbery, and of the Persons concerned therein, so as they may be Convicted of the same.
