

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE  
ACT, 1924.

(14 and 15 Geo. 5. Ch. 38.)

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by subsection (2) of section 70 of the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the National Health Insurance (Investment Account, Rate of Interest) Regulations, 1936.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1933.

COUNTIES OF DORSET, SOMERSET AND WILTSHIRE.

Whereas in pursuance of Section 140 of the Local Government Act, 1933, proposals have been made to the Minister of Health by the County Councils for the administrative Counties of Dorset, Somerset and Wilts, for the purpose of altering the boundaries of the Counties, and of effecting the consequential changes in areas of local government, details of which are contained in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas a Provisional Order made by the Minister under the enactment aforesaid for the alteration of the boundary of a County, may deal with any of the matters mentioned in Section 148 of the Local Government Act, 1933, and may amend any local Act or statutory Order, and may also repeal, alter or amend any Provisional Order made under the Sanitary Acts or the Public Health Act, 1875:

Notice is hereby given that F. H. Seabrooke, Esq., A.M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Minister of Health, will attend at The Council Chamber, Municipal Offices, King George Street, Yeovil, Somerset, on Wednesday, the 29th day of April, 1936, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a local Inquiry into the proposals of the Councils of the Counties of Dorset, Somerset and Wilts, and into any objections or representations which may be made with respect to the proposals or any of them, for the purpose of reporting to the Minister whether a Provisional Order should be made by the Minister giving effect to the proposals or for such other alteration as he may deem expedient:

And notice is hereby given that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be

heard with reference to the subject-matter of the Inquiry.

Parishes parts of which are proposed to be transferred:—

*To Dorset from Somerset:—*

Transfer of part of the Parish of Wayford (Chard Rural District) to the Parish of Broadwindsor (Beaminster Rural District).

*To Somerset from Dorset:—*

Transfer of part of the Parish of Purse Caundle (Sherborne Rural District) to the Parish of Milborne Port (Wincanton Rural District).

*To Somerset from Wiltshire:—*

Transfer of part of the Parish of Southwick which includes the district known as Rode Hill (Warminster and Westbury Rural District), to the Parish of Rode (Frome Rural District).

ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.
