The KING will hold a Levée at St. James's Palace on Tuesday, the 26th May, and a Levée at Buckingham Palace on Tuesday, the 9th June, at 11.30 a.m. on both occasions.

N.B.—The 26th May is a Collar Day.
The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

DRESS.

Navy. Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R.— No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform, and who are not required by the Regulations to provide it—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

Army. Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

Air Force. Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

Civilians. Levée Dress.

Gentlemen attending in Velvet Court Dress will wear a black crepe band, 3½ inches wide, on the left arm, above the elbow.

Gentlemen attending in the Alternative Dress will wear a black waistcoat, but not a mourning band.

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than

those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. A gentleman presented for the first time can only present his son on the occasion when he himself is presented.

3. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

5. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

6. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their
