Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Ottery Saint Mary, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas by the Will dated the 16th day of December, 1897, of the late William Henry Metcalfe, of Cyprus House, Exmouth, in the said County of Devon, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ottery Saint Mary was devised to certain trustees upon the trusts therein mentioned, and subject and without prejudice to such trusts upon trust for his right heirs:

"And whereas the said William Henry Metcalfe died on the 3rd day of February, 1960:

"And whereas Henry Fenwick Metcalfe, of Longacre, Colwall, in the County of Worcester, Esquire, and John William Metcalfe, of the Vicarage, Stoke Canon, in the said County of Devon, Clerk in Holy Orders, are the present trustees of the said Advowson:

"And whereas the said John William Metcalfe is the eldest son of the said William Henry Metcalfe:

"And whereas the said Henry Fenwick Metcalfe and John William Metcalfe are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ottery Saint Mary should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Exeter for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ottery Saint Mary which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Ottery Saint Mary:

say, in the Parish of Ottery Saint Mary:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Fenwick Metcalfe and John William Metcalfe (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any

conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ottery Saint Mary shall be transferred to the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.
