

their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

10. The retention of Assistant Land Commissioners will be conditional on the Ministry being satisfied as to their conduct and capacity.

11. An Assistant Land Commissioner will be eligible for subsequent appointment to the established staff as vacancies occur therein. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a certificate of qualification; a fee of £4 being the balance of the prescribed fee of £8 is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

Romney and Denge Marsh Main Drains Catchment Board.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the Romney and Denge Marsh Main Drains Catchment Board have made application under sub-section (3) of Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, that the statutory map of the Catchment Area be varied so far as relates to the extent of the "main river," by adding to the "main river" as shown on the said map the following watercourses:—

1. *Engine Sewer (Lesser Sewer)* from Appledore Pumping Station to Piper's Pen—about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
2. *Blackman's Arm (Lesser Sewer)* from its junction with Engine Sewer to its junction with the Main Sewer at Kenardington—about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
3. *Sperringbrook (Lesser Sewer)* from its junction with Horsemarsh Sewer at Railway Bridge to Bridge Farm, Warehorne—about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.
4. *Ham Mill Arm (Lesser Sewer)* from Stockbridge to its junction with the Royal Military Canal—about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
5. *The Private Ditches* from the North End of Little Bilsington Sewer (Lesser Sewer) to Bridge Farm, Bilsington, and Marshland Sewer (Lesser Sewer) from Bridge Farm, Bilsington to Marshland Main Sewer—about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

A copy of the statutory map on which the proposed variations are to be made may be

inspected at the Office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, 11, Bank Street, Ashford, Kent, or at the Offices of the Ministry. Any objection to the proposed variations shall be made in writing and sent by post addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at the address mentioned below, so as to reach that Office within thirty-one days from the date of this notice.
