THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907,
AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

BY an Order dated the 9th day of April, 1936, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 27th day of April, 1936, the following provisions of the above-mentioned Acts shall be in force in the Urban District of Bakewell, namely: The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, Part II (Streets and Buildings) other than sections 21, 24 and 27 to 31 (inclusive); Part III (Sanitary provisions) other than section 51; Part IV (Infectious diseases) other than sections 61 and 68; Part VI (Recreation Grounds); and Part X (Miscellaneous) other than section 95; The Public Health Act, 1925, Part VI (Recreation Grounds). The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards sections 23, 25, 35, 38 and 92 of the Act of 1907 to the conditions specified in the Order. PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT
ACT, 1907.

CITY OF BIRMINGHAM.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT—SECTIONS 101 AND 102.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Birmingham have applied to the Traffic Commissioners for the West Midland Traffic Area for consent under Sections 101 and 102 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, to the running by the said Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of public service vehicles on the under-mentioned roads situate outside the City of Birmingham:—

(A distance of 5 miles 1,112 yards.)
Stage	Windmill Lane—Cape Hill junction, Smethwick and Bearwood Road—Poplar Road junction, Smethwick.	Waterloo Road, Smethwick, Bearwood Road, Smethwick (from Dawson Street to its junction with Poplar Road). (A distance of 1 mile 283 yards.)
Stage	Birmingham City Boundary, Heath Street, Smethwick, and Rabone Lane—Soho Street junction, Smethwick.	Heath Street, Smethwick, Cranford Street, Smethwick, Soho Street, Smethwick (from Oakfield Road to its junction with Rabone Lane). (A distance of 920 yards.)

Any objection by any of the persons or bodies named in Section 102 (1) of the said Act in respect of this application must be in writing and must state the grounds on which it is based, and must be sent in triplicate to the Traffic Commissioners for the West Midland Area, York House, Great Charles Street, Birmingham, so as to reach them not later than the 15th day of May 1936, and at the same time a copy thereof must be sent to the undersigned.
