

24. To make provision as to the recovery summarily of sums due for fittings and as to the recovery of penalties and of other sums due to the Company.

25. To make new or further provision with reference to the Company's affairs, including provisions as to the reservation of a proportion of each issue of share capital for employees and consumers of the Company; the sale of share capital to such employees and consumers; the limitation of dividend on preference capital of the Company; the appointment of auditors of the Company; directors holding office under or contracting with the Company; the remuneration of the Secretary of the Company; the trusts to which share capital or debenture stock of the Company may be subject; the register of shareholders and shareholders' address book of the Company; an indemnity to be required before the issue of substituted certificates; the minimum holdings of share capital and debenture stock; the time and place of meetings of the Company and giving of notices of such meetings; the quorum for general meetings; the appointment of proxies; the rights of joint-holders; and the costs and expenses of the intended Order.

26. To confer upon the Company all or any powers commonly conferred on gas undertakers and not hereinbefore referred to, and to enact all such provisions as may be deemed expedient for effecting the purposes of the intended Order.

27. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Newport (Monmouthshire) Gas Acts and Orders, 1855 to 1922, and to incorporate with the intended Order (with or without modifications) all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845 and the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the sixth day of June, 1936.

Any objection must state:—

(a) The specific grounds of objection, and

(b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for;

and a copy thereof must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitor.

A copy of the draft Special Order, and of ordnance maps showing the situation of the existing works and of the proposed works of the Company and the boundaries of the existing authorised area for the supply of gas and of the added limits, and ordnance maps showing the lands to be used for the storage of gas have been deposited for public inspection at the offices of the Company at Mill Street, Newport, Monmouthshire, at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Monmouth at County Hall, Newport aforesaid and at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Glamorgan at County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff, Glamorganshire.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS 1882 TO 1935.

LLWCHWR ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the South Wales Electric Power Company whose principal office is situate at Thames House, Millbank, in the City of Westminster (hereinafter called "the Company") have applied to the Electricity Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1935 for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1.—(a) To authorise the Company to supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within so much of the Urban District of Llwchwr in the County of Glamorgan as is not comprised within the area of supply of the Gorseinon Electric Light Company Limited under the Gorseinon Electricity Orders 1910 and 1924, that is to say, that part of the Parish of Llangyfelach in the said Urban District lying generally to the east and north east of an imaginary straight line drawn from the point where the boundaries of the Parishes of Mawr, Llangyfelach (formerly Penderry) and Llandilo Talybont intersect to the centre of the River Llan near the Mill known as Melin Llan two hundred yards or thereabouts north of the road from Penllergaer to Llangyfelach and then along the centre of the River Llan to the Bridge carrying the road from Penllergaer to Fforest-Fach at Pont Cadle (hereinafter called "the said area").

(b) To authorise the Company to supply within the said area electricity generated outside the said area.

(c) To incorporate with the Order (with or without modifications or exceptions) all or any of the provisions of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 and the Acts and portions of Acts incorporated therewith to confer upon the Company all or any powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1935 and to confer on the Company all such powers as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the undertaking and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would, or might interfere with any such objects.

(d) To provide that Sections 83 and 84 of the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 shall not apply to the Company or to the Undertaking under the Order.

2. Copies of the draft Order and map have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Glamorgan, County Hall, Cardiff and at the office of the Clerk of the Llwchwr Urban District Council, Council Offices, West Street, Gorseinon.
