

Adlestrop) shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop, and all other the endowment and property (excepting the Parsonage House) now belonging to the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell.

"7. That upon the unions taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell for obtaining the services of a Curate to reside at Broadwell and the endowments and property of the same United Benefice other than the Parsonage House and Glebe shall be charged with a sum of £230 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £230 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £230 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said Curate as aforesaid.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold and (b) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons of the said Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop and Oddington shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, such right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop to be made after the unions and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Oddington having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the same United Benefice to be made after the unions and every alternate turn thereafter.

"9. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Upper with Nether Swell, namely the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford and Mark Fenwick, Esquire, J.P., of Abbotswold, Stow on the Wold (the consent of the said Dean and Chapter being testified by their causing their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme and the consent of the said Mark Fenwick being testified by his signing this Scheme) and with the consents also of the said Frederick Macduff Christian Hare (testified as aforesaid) and of the Reverend John Harris MacCleary being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Upper with Nether Swell (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the unions taking effect all those parts of the said respective Parishes of Upper Swell and Nether Swell which are now included within the area of the Civil Parish of Stow on the Wold shall be

transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, of the Act
