In the Matter of CENTRAL ARGENTINE RAILWAY Limited, and in the Matter of the Companies Act, 1929,

NOTICE is hereby given that by an Order dated the 7th May, 1936, the Court has directed a Meeting of the holders of the 6 per cent.
