DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1935.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Order No. 5410.

(Dated 15th May, 1936.)

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (IMPORTATION OF THERAPEUTIC SUBSTANCES) ORDER OF 1936.

SUBJECT.

(1) Prohibits the landing in Great Britain of any of the therapeutic substances to which Part II of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1935, applies (as set out in the First Schedule to the Order, as repeated below) unless the container is labelled with a clear description of its contents and place and country of origin.

(2) Prohibits the landing in Great Britain of contagious abortion vaccine, live or dead, except by licence obtained from the Ministry.

Any person contravening the provisions of the Order renders himself liable to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st July, 1936.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Therapeutic Substances to which Part II of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1935, applies.

Part II of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1935, applies to the following substances in so far only as they are excluded from the operation of the Therapeutic Substances Act, 1925, as being intended to be used solely for veterinary purposes, by regulations made under that Act, that is to say:—

(1) The substances commonly known as vaccines, sera, toxins, antitoxins and antigens.

(2) The substance commonly known as salvarsan (Dioxy-diamino-arseno-benzol-dihydrochloride) and analogous substances used for the specific treatment of infective disease.

(3) Extract of the pituitary body.

BOGNOR GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade forthwith by the Bognor Gas and Electricity Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), whose address is Argyle Road, Bognor Regis, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company upon the land hereinafter described to erect, maintain, alter, improve and renew works for the storage of gas with all necessary machinery and apparatus ancillary thereto and do all such acts as may be proper for storing gas and for supplying gas within their limits of supply.
