BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION

DECLARING HIS MAJESTY'S PLEASURE TOUCHING HIS ROYAL CORONATION AND THE SOLEMNITY THEREOF.

EDWARD R.I.

WHEREAS We have resolved, by the Favour and Blessing of Almighty God, to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation at Westminster upon Wednesday the Twelfth Day of May next; and forasmuch as by ancient Customs and Usages of this Realm, as also in regard of divers Tenures of sundry Manors, Lands, and other Hereditaments many of Our loving Subjects do claim and are bound to do and perform divers Services on the said Day, and at the Time of the Coronation, as in Times precedent their Ancestors and those from whom they claim have done and performed at the Coronations of Our famous Progenitors and Predecessors, Kings and Queens of this Realm; We, therefore, out of Our Princely Care for the Preservation of the lawful Rights and Inheritances of Our loving Subjects whom it may concern, have thought fit to give Notice of and publish Our Resolution therein; and do hereby give Notice of and publish the same accordingly: And We do hereby further signify, That, by Our Commission under Our Great Seal of the Realm, We have appointed and authorized Our Most Dear Brother and

Counsellor His Royal Highness Albert Frederick Arthur George, Duke of York; Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Counsellor the Most Reverend Father in God Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan; Our right trusty and well beloved Cousin and Counsellor Douglas McGarel, Viscount Hailsham, Our Chancellor of Great Britain; Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Counsellor the Most Reverend Father in God William, Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan; Our right trusty and well beloved Counsellors Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister and First Commissioner of Our Treasury; and James Ramsay MacDonald, President of Our Council; Our right trusty and well beloved Cousin and Counsellor Edward Frederick Lindley, Viscount Halifax, Keeper of Our Privy Seal; Our right trusty and right entirely beloved Cousins and Counsellors Bernard Marmaduke, Duke of Norfolk, Earl Marshal and Our Hereditary Marshal of England; and William John Arthur Charles James, Duke of Portland; Our right trusty and entirely beloved Cousins and Counsellors James Edward Hubert, Marquess of Salisbury; Lawrence John Lumley, Marquess of Zetland, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State; and Robert Offley Ashburton, Marquess of Crewe; Our right trusty and right well beloved Cousins and Counsellors Rowland Thomas, Earl of Cromer, Lord Chamberlain of Our Household; Anthony, Earl of Shaftesbury, Lord Steward of Our Household;

Bernard Arthur William Patrick Hastings, Earl of Granard, Master of Our Horse; Edward George Villiers, Earl of Derby; David Alexander Edward, Earl of Crawford and Balcarres; Richard William Alan, Earl of Onslow; and Alexander Augustus Frederick William Alfred George, Earl of Athlone; Our right trusty and well beloved Cousins and Counsellors Philip, Viscount Swinton, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State; and Bolton Meredith, Viscount Monsell, First Commissioner of Our Admiralty; Our right trusty and well beloved Counsellor the Right Reverend Father in God Arthur Foley, Bishop of London; Our right trusty and well beloved Counsellors Gordon, Lord Hewart, Lord Chief Justice of England; William, Lord Thankerton, Lord of Appeal in Ordinary; Robert Alderson, Lord Wright, Master of the Rolls; Clive, Lord Wigram; Sir John Allsebrook Simon, Robert Anthony Eden, Alfred Duff Cooper, Malcolm MacDonald, and Sir Godfrey Pattison Collins, five of Our Principal Secretaries of State; William George Arthur Ormsby-Gore, First Commissioner of Our Works and Public Buildings; Sir Joseph Austen Chamberlain; David Lloyd George; Winston Leonard Spencer-Churchill; John Robert Clynes; Arthur Neville Chamberlain, Chancellor and Under Treasurer of Our Exchequer; Hastings Bertrand Lees-Smith; Sir Archibald Henry Macdonald Sinclair, Baronet; Wilfrid Guild Normand, Lord Justice General and President of the Court of Session in Scotland; and Clement Richard Attlee; or any five or more of them to receive, hear, and determine the Petitions and Claims which shall be to them exhibited by any of Our loving Subjects in this Behalf; and We do hereby appoint such of Our said Commissioners as may be summoned for that Purpose to sit in the Council Chamber at Whitehall upon the first convenient Day to be hereafter notified by Publication in the London, Edinburgh, and Belfast Gazette, respectively, and from Time to Time to adjourn as to them shall seem meet, for the Execution of Our said Commission, which We do thus publish, to the Intent that all such Persons whom it may any-ways concern may know when and where to give their Attendance for the exhibiting of their Petitions and Claims concerning their Services before mentioned to be done and performed at Our said Coronation: And We do hereby signify and declare that it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure that such Part only of the Solemnity and Ceremony of Our Royal Coronation as is usually upon the Coronation of the Kings and Queens of this Realm solemnized in Westminster Abbey, shall take place. And We do further by this Our Royal Proclamation signify and declare that We do dispense, upon the Occasion of this Our Coronation, with the Services and Attendance of all Persons who do claim and are bound to do and perform any Services which, according to ancient Custom or Usage, are to be performed in Westminster Hall or in the Procession. And We do hereby further graciously declare that such Dispensation shall not interfere with the Rights and Privileges of any of Our loving Subjects to claim the Performances of such several Services or any of them at any future Coronation. And We do hereby, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, declare and make known to all such of Our

loving Subjects as it may concern, that it seems good to Us that the Committee of Claims shall, upon the Occasion of this Our Coronation, exclude from their Consideration such Claims as may be submitted to them in respect of Rights or Services connected with the Parts of the Ceremonial in Times past performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects whom it may concern that all Persons, of what Rank or Quality soever they be, who either upon Our Letters to them directed, or by reason of their Offices and Tenures, or otherwise, are to do any Service at the time of Our Coronation, other than Service anciently done and performed in Westminster Hall or in the Procession, do duly give their Attendance at the said Solemnity on Wednesday the Twelfth day of May next, in all respects furnished and appointed as to so great a Solemnity appertaineth and answerable to the Dignities and Places which every one of them respectively holdeth and enjoyeth, and of this they or any of them are not to fail, as they will answer the contrary at their Perils, unless, upon special Reasons by Ourselves under Our Hand to be allowed, We shall dispense with any of their Services or Attendances.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-eighth Day of *May*, in the Year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and in the First Year of Our Reign.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, on the 23rd day of May, 1936, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation, commonly called Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the 9th day of May, 1936 (notice of the proposed amending Statutes having been given to the University), and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation, commonly called Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE XLIX.

INVESTMENT OF CAPITAL MONEYS.

By adding at the end of this Statute the following Section to form Section 5 of the same Statute:—

"5. In order to facilitate the management of investments under the control of the College, the Council may at any time and from time to time resolve that all or any part of the funds of any two or more trusts be treated as one amalgamated fund invested for the rateable benefit of the relative trusts, and to and upon any such resolution the following provisions shall apply:

(a) An investment shall not be brought into an amalgamated fund either upon its

first constitution or upon any change of investment unless it is an authorised investment for all the trusts interested in the amalgamated fund.

(b) An amalgamated fund shall be held on behalf of the relative trusts in shares as nearly as may conveniently be proportionate to the respective capital values of the funds brought in on behalf of the trusts respectively upon the first constitution of the amalgamated fund, such shares to be fixed by resolution of the Council, and the divisible income of the amalgamated fund shall be distributed among the trusts in proportion to the shares so fixed.

(c) The Council may at any time withhold from division any part of the income of an amalgamated fund and add the same to the capital of the fund as a provision against capital depreciation or reduction in income on changes of investment.

(d) The Council may at any time increase any amalgamated fund by adding thereto any funds not already comprised therein of any trust, and upon any such increase shall fix the share of such trust in the resulting aggregate fund, and the Council may at any time wind up any amalgamated fund and divide the investments thereof between the relative trusts in proportion to their respective shares therein or may bring all or any of the shares into a new or other amalgamated fund in accordance with the provisions of this Section."

STATUTE LI.

DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUES.

By repealing subsection (a) of section 1 of this Statute and substituting therefor the following subsection to form subsection (a) of section 1 of the same Statute:—

"(a) to the Master a sum not exceeding £500 to meet the expenses arising out of the duties of his office, including entertainment and clerical assistance."

SCHEDULE.

PART II.

By repealing Part II of the Schedule to the Statutes and substituting the following words to form Part II of the same Schedule:—

"The Qualifying University Offices are the offices of University Librarian, Registrar, Treasurer, Secretary General of the Faculties, and Director of the Fitzwilliam Museum, and such Professorships, Readerships and other offices as by the Statutes and Ordinances of the University for the time being qualify their holders for the tenure of Professorial Fellowships."

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London on the 3rd day of March and concluded on the 6th day of May, 1936, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz. :—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins, with four additional coins from one of such packets, making altogether thirty-three crowns, thirty-three

half-crowns, thirty-three florins, twenty-nine shillings, forty-two sixpences, one fourpence, twenty-nine threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising six crowns, six half-crowns, five florins, five shillings, eight sixpences, one fourpence, five threepences, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay minus twelve thousandths ($-.012$) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus six ten thousandths ($-.0006$) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being one ounce and one hundred and twenty-eight thousandths of an ounce (-1.128) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th June, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of

the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th June, 1936, to Saturday, the 13th June, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
