I, the Right Honourable Robert Alderson, Baron Wright, Master of the Rolls, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1877, and the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1898, do, with the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and the further approval of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for Dominion Affairs and for the Colonies, hereby make the following Rules.

1. The mode of disposal of documents shall be by destruction, unless the Master of the Rolls shall direct the disposal thereof by transfer to the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions or to the curators, trustees or other governors of a library in any part of His Majesty's dominions or, in the case of income accounts of Trustees, by transfer or return thereof to such Trustees or their

Successors.

2. The proposed mode of disposal of the documents included in each schedule shall be mentioned in the schedule. When the documents are to be transferred to the curators, trustees, or other governors of a library, the particular library shall be named in the schedule. When the documents are to be destroyed, such destruction shall be effected under the direction of the Controller of His

Majesty's Stationery Office.

3. These Rules shall take effect in place of the thirteenth Rule of the Rules made by the Right Honourable William Baron Esher, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 30th day of June, 1890, and the Rule made by the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Hardy Cozens-Hardy, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 4th day of June, 1908, and the Rule made by the Right Honourable Ernest, Baron Hanworth, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1929.

"4. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the pension payable as aforesaid to the said George Clarke Keble, whichever shall the later happen, the net income derived by the Incumbent of the United Benefice from all the tithe rentcharges vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty and formerly attached to the said two Benefices of Ardington and East Lockinge respectively and from the proceeds of the redemption of any such tithe rentcharges and from the securities representing the accumulations of sinking fund payments in respect of the same tithe rentcharges upon the extinguishment thereof in accordance with the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1925, and any capital moneys, securities or other property representing such tithe rentcharges and sinking fund payments by reason of the extinguishment or conversion thereof otherwise than under the said Act shall be appropriated and distributed by Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty or other the persons or body responsible for the distribution thereof as follows, that is to say, as to nine-thirteenth parts of such net income in payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice and as to the remaining four-thir-teenth parts thereof in payment to the Incumbents of the two Benefices next mentioned in the following shares that is to say one half share to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Northbourne and one half share to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hagbourne, both of which Benefices are situate in the said Diocese of Oxford, and the net income derived from any such tithe rentcharge so vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty shall be the balance payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice under the provisions of Section 5 of the Tithe Act, 1925, after the transfer payment and deductions made in accordance with the same Section from the gross amount actually collected from time to

That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice in the performance of the duties thereof and that a part of the endowments of the United Benefice, that is to say an annual sum of £184 being part of an annual payment of £240 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bristol, Saint Augustine the Less, shall be appropriated and paid by us

to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of a Curate.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Dunston, and partly out of the Parish of Whickham, both in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Christ Church, Dunston, and the said Parish of Whickham are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Dunston, and of the said Parish of Whickham which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship:

of the said intended District shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid and to his successors:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Withersfield is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Samuel John Marton Sampson, of Bury Saint Edmunds, in the said County of Suffolk, Solicitor:

"And whereas the said Samuel John Marton Sampson is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Withersfield, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
