and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Manchester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

assigned: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Northenden which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Luke, Benchill'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Luke, Benchill, being:-

"All that part of the Parish of Northenden, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the east

and upon part of the north-east by the New Parish of Saint James, Gatley, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, upon the remaining part of the north-east by the Parish of Saint James, Didsbury, in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Manchester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west, and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint James, Didsbury, from the said Parish of Northenden crosses the middle of the main line of the Cheshire Lines Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 67 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries it across Baguley Brook, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Baguley Brook for a distance of 1 mile and 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the stream which flows through Poundswick, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of the last mentioned stream for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Poundswick Lane across such stream, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 1 mile and 30 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Gatley Brook opposite to the junction of Finney Lane with the road leading from Styal to Gatley, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Northenden from the said New Parish of Saint James, Gatley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Northenden out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.
