DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

(EDWARD INGLEDEW MCGREGOR.)

Whereas Edward Ingledew McGregor, M.R.C.V.S., of 3, Cumberland Road, St. Albans, Hertfordshire, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Edward Ingledew McGregor cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Edward Ingledew McGregor the authority granted by the said Regulations to registered veterinary surgeons to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Edward Ingledew McGregor to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made Orders authorising the employment on two day-shifts of:—
