

to the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham (2) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Higham Green, Saint Stephen, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham Green and (3) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Dalham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to one moiety thereof for the benefit of the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham and as to the other moiety of the said net proceeds for the benefit of the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham Green.

"5. That upon the said unions taking effect all the Tithe Rentcharges arising within the Parish of the said Benefice of Kentford and being part of the endowments at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford and all capital sums of money and stocks representing or being the produce of the sale redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of such Tithe Rentcharges shall become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham Green and all the other endowments of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford shall become and be part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham.

"6. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the respective United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham shall be exercised by the Patrons of the Benefice of Dalham and the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Dalham having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham to be made after the unions and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Gazeley with Dalham to be made after the unions and every alternate turn thereafter and (b) the right of presentation to the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham Green shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Higham Green, Saint Stephen, and the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Higham Green, Saint Stephen, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham Green to be made after the unions and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Gazeley with Kentford having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Kentford with Higham

Green to be made after the unions and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union (of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 :

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.
