PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of light-houses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is amongst other things provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council made on the dates set out in the First Schedule hereto in exercise of the above recited powers the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners) being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling and by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.
2. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936.
3. The Orders in Council, the dates whereof are set out in the First Schedule hereto, are hereby revoked, save and in so far as the Order in Council dated the 15th day of May, 1930, revokes the Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1924.
4. Subject to the provisions of this Order the establishment of the Commissioners shall consist of the posts enumerated in the Second

Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum, annual increase and maximum as well as the dates from which such salaries are to be effective are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule, but the annual increase of such salaries shall (except in the case of the Secretary) be only granted on a Certificate by the Commissioners that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry and regularity.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order Mr. John Vass, at present the holder of the post of Superintendent mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, may be paid an annual allowance of £110 over and above the scale of salary specified for that post in the said Schedule such annual allowance to count as salary for the purpose of calculating the superannuation allowance or compensation to which he may be entitled on discharge or retirement.

6. The following provisions in respect of age, examination, appointment and retirement shall take effect, that is to say:—

(a) all persons appointed in future to the executive, shorthand-typist and typist grade on the establishment of the Commissioners

shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) below, previously to their appointment pass such examination as may be arranged, and such examination shall be held under conditions which are similar to those for candidates sitting for examinations for similar posts in the Civil Service;

(b) all officers appointed to posts on the establishment fixed by this Order shall be governed by conditions of service, including promotion and superannuation benefits, similar to those governing Civil Servants of the corresponding grades.

7. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of March,

1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Stillingfleet, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

“ Whereas by a Conveyance made the 26th day of November, 1935, between the Official Trustee of Charity Lands of the first part, the Very Reverend Herbert Newell Bate, Dean of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Saint Peter in York, the Venerable Arthur Creyke England, Archdeacon of York and a Canon in the said Cathedral Church, the Right Reverend Harry St. John Stirling Woolcombe, Bishop of Whitby, the Reverend John Solloway of the Vicarage, Selby, in the said County of York, a Canon of the said Cathedral Church, the Reverend Frederick Harrison, of Number 4 Minster Yard, in the City of York, Chancellor and Canon of the said Cathedral Church, the Reverend William Joseph Mundy Coombs of Sutton-on-the-Forest, in the said County of York, Canon of the said Cathedral Church, Sir William Worsley, of Hovingham Hall in the said County of York, Baronet, Frederick William Chapman, of Mulberry Dene, Grange Croft, in the City of York, Esquire, Cuthbert Morrell, of The Mount, in the said City of York, Esquire, James Hopwood, of Rose Cottage, Fulford, in the said County of York, Esquire, John Harry Jones of Highfield House, Headingley Lane, in the City of Leeds, Professor of Leeds University, and Charles Warwick Whitworth, of Nun Monkton Priory, in the said County of York, a Barrister-at-law, being the duly constituted Governors for the time being of the Charity called Saint Peter's School, York, otherwise York Cathedral Grammar School (hereinafter called ‘ the said Governors ’) of the second part, and the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Saint Peter in York (hereinafter called ‘ the said Dean and Chapter ’) of the third part, after reciting that by virtue of a Scheme of the Board of Education sealed by the Board on the 13th day of December, 1912, the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stillingfleet became vested in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands for all the estate and interest therein belonging to or held in trust for the Foundation known as Saint Peter's School, York, otherwise York Cathedral Grammar School, and that by an Order of the same Board dated the 24th day of June, 1935, it was ordered that the said Governors might within one year from the date thereof sell the said Advowson for the sum of £100 it was witnessed that in consideration of the sum of £100 the said Governors in the name and on behalf of the said Official

Trustee of Charity Lands did thereby convey unto the said Dean and Chapter the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stillingfleet to hold the same unto the said Dean and Chapter in fee simple:

“ And whereas the said Conveyance was made with the intention of vesting the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage or presentation in the said Dean and Chapter in perpetuity, and the parties thereto are desirous that anything which by way of further assurance or otherwise may be required effectually to carry out that intention may be done, and have applied to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that a Scheme under the Acts hereinbefore mentioned may be prepared for the said purpose and submitted to Your Majesty in Council:

“ And whereas the said Governors, in the name and on behalf of the Official Trustee of Charity Lands, and the said Dean and Chapter are consenting to this Scheme; and in token thereof have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, has to the same transfer given that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary and in token of the same consent has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stillingfleet which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Stillingfleet:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Governors in the name and on behalf of the Official Trustee of Charity Lands (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter (in witness whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stillingfleet shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter and their successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter and by their successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further

or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice') of Great with Little Plumstead, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas under the terms of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 12th day of October, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, for effecting the union of the Benefice of Great Plumstead and the Benefice of Little Plumstead, two one-third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Great with Little Plumstead (that is to say, the first and third turn in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the said United Benefice after the union) were assigned to the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Plumstead:

"And whereas Catherine Louisa White, of Braeside, Aviemore Road, Crowborough, in the County of Sussex, Widow, the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Plumstead, by her Will, dated the 5th day of October, 1934, devised the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to such Benefice to the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the said Catherine Louisa White died on the 10th day of November, 1935:

"And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Great Plumstead and Little Plumstead took effect on the 24th day of January, 1936:

"And whereas the Reverend Trevor Joseph Hamilton Carson, of Braeside, Aviemore Road, Crowborough, in the said County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Thomas Piercy Mills, of Number 8, New Square, Lincoln's Inn, London, Esquire, are the executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice would now be vested and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that such part or share of the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Great with Little Plumstead which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Great Plumstead and Little Plumstead:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Trevor Joseph Hamilton Carson and Thomas Piercy Mills (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said two one-third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Great with Little Plumstead shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and

be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Maidstone, Saint Peter, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Allington, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the

said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Maidstone, St. Peter, and Allington, duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester, has also signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Allington is vested in fee simple in the Right Honourable Charles, Earl of Romney, as tenant for life and estate owner free from incumbrances and the said Charles, Earl of Romney, is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, is vested in the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his Successors in the same Archbishopric:

"And whereas the said Charles, Earl of Romney, is willing that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Allington shall be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall be vested wholly in the See of Canterbury:

"And whereas the said Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester, has also executed this Scheme in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Allington which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of the said Benefice of Allington hereinafter recommended and proposed to be united with the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Maidstone, Saint Peter, and Allington are now full, the Reverend Charles William Martyn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, and the Reverend Hubert Thomas Parks being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Allington:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Maidstone, Saint Peter, and

Allington, based upon the terms of the hereinbefore mentioned Report to the Archbishop of Canterbury and, further, for effecting such transfer of Patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent so far, as the transfer of Patronage hereinafter recommended is concerned of the said Charles, Earl of Romney, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal) and with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Allington shall be transferred to the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

"2. That the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, and the said Benefice of Allington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, with Allington', and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Canterbury, of the Archdeaconry of Maidstone and of the Rural Deanery of Sutton, but the Parishes of the said Benefice shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Allington only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Archbishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Archbishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, and the then Incumbent of Allington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Maidstone, Saint Peter, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Allington and if neither of the said two Bene-

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, Section 66, and of the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, Section 20, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the endowments of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Hereford and to the endowment of the Deanery of the said Cathedral Church:

“Whereas by the said Section 66 of the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, as amended by Section 20 of the said Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, it is provided that by a Scheme of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, ratified by Order of Your Majesty in Council in the manner in the said Acts contemplated, such annual sum may be determined on to be paid and shall accordingly be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as after due enquiry and calculation shall give to the Dean of every Cathedral Church in England an average annual income of £1,000 and that it shall be lawful by such Scheme and Order in Council to carry such purpose into effect by any mode of payment, contribution, augmentation or endowment which may be deemed fit:

“And whereas the Chapter of the said Cathedral Church now consists of a Dean and four Canons, one canonry having been suspended under the provisions of the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, and we are entitled to receive the profits and emoluments of the said suspended canonry under the provisions of the same Act:

“And whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council bearing date the 7th August, 1851, and duly published in the London Gazette on the 19th September, 1851, and made under the authority of the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, Section 66, and of the said Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, Section 20, and hereinafter referred to as ‘the Order of 1851.’ provision is made for securing to the Dean of

the said Cathedral Church an annual income of £1,000, it being by the Order of 1851 provided that the amount (if any) which may be necessary to make up the income of the said Dean for each year to the sum of £1,000 shall be paid by us to the said Dean and that the amount of any surplus of the same income over £1,000 shall be retained by the treasurer of the said Chapter and be carried by him to our credit in the account for the next succeeding year and so on from time to time until the average income of the said Dean shall again be below the sum of £1,000:

“ And whereas the Cathedral Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Cathedral Measures, 1931 and 1934, have, with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter and of the Right Reverend Lisle, Lord Bishop of Hereford, framed and approved a scheme containing the Constitution and New Statutes for the said Cathedral Church, which scheme provides, *inter alia*, for the establishment and regulation of a General Fund into which there shall be paid all moneys accruing to the said Dean and Chapter from any source whatsoever other than moneys which shall be payable to other funds of the said Dean and Chapter set up under the said scheme of the Cathedral Commissioners and described as ‘the College Fund’, ‘the Fabric Fund’, ‘the Cathedral Fund’, and ‘Special Funds’:

“ And whereas the said scheme of the Cathedral Commissioners provides, or is intended to provide, (*inter alia*) the following arrangements and regulations for the administration and application of the said General Fund, namely, that out of the said General Fund there shall be paid *first*, the cost of structural repairs of the houses assigned to and occupied by, the Dean and Canons in virtue of their offices and, *secondly*, all expenses incurred by the Dean and Chapter which are not chargeable to the College Fund, the Fabric Fund, the Cathedral Fund, or to any Special Fund; and that when all the aforesaid charges have been met, the balance of the General Fund, as shown at the audit held at the end of each financial year, shall be calculated as a gross sum irrespective of any income tax paid or allowed from receipts or any income tax deducted from out-payments or otherwise recovered for the said General Fund; and that the gross sum so calculated as aforesaid shall be dealt with and applied as follows, namely, there shall be added to it the cost during the year ended at the date of the said audit of any structural repairs of the houses assigned to and occupied by the Dean and Canons in virtue of their offices as aforesaid and there shall be deducted from it the sum of £1,000 gross which is intended to be paid by us yearly into the capitular revenues of the said Cathedral Church as hereinafter provided and also the amount of any grant which may be paid by us into the said capitular revenues under the provisions of Section 20 of the Cathedrals Measure 1931 (the amount of which grant shall be expended solely upon the objects for which it may be made); and that one-third part of the resultant sum shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as hereinafter provided and the remainder of the said gross sum (excluding the amount expended as aforesaid on the structural repairs of the houses

assigned to and occupied by the Dean and Canons in virtue of their offices but including the aforesaid sum of £1,000 gross and any grant made expressly for the augmentation of the stipends of the Dean and Canons) shall thereupon be called the Divisible Sum; and that the share of the said capitular revenues which shall be allocated as the stipends of the Dean and Canons shall be such portion of the said Divisible Sum as does not in any year exceed £4,200 gross; and that of such portion, subject to such deductions and payments as are authorised or intended so to be by other parts of the said scheme of the Cathedral Commissioners for England the Dean shall receive one-third part thereof in each year (or if such one-third part shall be less than £1,000 in any year then the Dean shall receive £1,000 out of the said Divisible Sum):

“ And whereas we are satisfied that the payment by us out of our Common Fund into the said capitular revenues of the annual gross sum of £1,000 hereinafter referred to and appropriated as hereinafter recommended and the payment to us in each year for the benefit of our Common Fund by the said Dean and Chapter of a sum calculated in accordance with the provisions of the said scheme of the Cathedral Commissioners for England will make ample provision for the payment to us of the aforesaid profits and emoluments of the said suspended canonry and for securing to the Dean of the said Cathedral Church an average annual income of £1,000, and that the arrangements hereinafter set forth will be the most convenient method of effecting for the future the purposes contemplated in the Order of 1851:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Hereford in their corporate capacity, testified by the corporate seal of the said Dean and Chapter affixed to this Scheme, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Lisle, Lord Bishop of Hereford, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter, testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme, and with the consent of the very Reverend Reginald Waterfield, Dean of the said Cathedral Church, testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme, we humbly recommend and propose as follows:—

“(1) That until such date as may be appointed by the said scheme of the said Cathedral Commissioners, if and when the same shall have been confirmed by virtue of any Order of Your Majesty in Council, as the date from which the aforesaid arrangements and regulations for the administration and application of the said General Fund shall be operative and shall take effect, we shall continue in the same manner as heretofore to receive the profits and emoluments of the said suspended Canonry and that the arrangements provided for in the Order of 1851 for the maintenance of the average annual income of the Dean shall continue in force.

“(2) That as from the date so appointed as aforesaid we shall become entitled to receive and the said Dean and Chapter shall pay to us in each year out of the General Fund of the said Dean and Chapter a part or share, calculated in the manner prescribed by the said scheme of the said Cathedral Commissioners for England as hereinbefore set forth,

of the said capitular revenues, and such payment to us by the said Dean and Chapter shall be deemed to include and shall be in full exoneration of the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the emoluments and profits to which we are entitled as aforesaid in respect of the said suspended Canonry.

"And we further recommend and propose that as from the date so appointed as aforesaid the provisions contained in the Order of 1851 shall cease and be of no effect.

"And we further recommend and propose that in consideration of the foregoing and for the purpose of providing and maintaining an average annual income for the Dean of £1,000 there shall be paid by us into the capitular revenues of the said Dean and Chapter by equal quarterly payments on the 25th March, 24th June, 29th September, and 25th December in every year the annual sum of £1,000, the first of such payments (or a due proportion thereof calculated as accruing from day to day from the date so appointed as aforesaid) to be payable upon the quarterly date of payment as aforesaid occurring next after the date so appointed as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the Treasurer or Chapter Clerk for the time being of the said Dean and Chapter shall be a good and valid discharge to us for all or any and every such sum or sums of money as shall therein be expressed to have been paid by us under the authority of this Scheme.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said annual sum of £1,000 to be paid by us in accordance with the recommendations hereinbefore contained to the said Dean and Chapter shall be appropriated by the said Dean and Chapter to and towards the payment of the income of the said Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that for the purpose of calculating the amounts due to us from the said Dean and Chapter in respect of the profits and emoluments of the said suspended Canonry and the amount due from us to the said Dean under the provisions of the Order of 1851 at the date so appointed as aforesaid the profits and emoluments of the said suspended Canonry and the income of the said Dean shall be deemed to be accruing from day to day and the respective amounts so due as aforesaid shall be determined accordingly.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in conformity with the said Acts or either of them or with any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Westbury on Trym is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Westbury on Trym which is herein-after mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the

said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Westbury on Trym which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'the District of Saint Stephen, Southmead'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Stephen, Southmead, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Westbury on Trym, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the north-west and upon the north by the Parish of Henbury, upon the east partly by the Parish of Filton, partly by the New Parish of Saint Gregory, Horfield, and partly by the Parish of Horfield, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Henleaze, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Henleaze, from the said Parish of Westbury on Trym, at the junction of Henleaze

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Ruislip is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Ruislip which is hereafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month the Benefice of Saint Paul, Bunhill Row, Finsbury, and the Benefice of Saint Mary, Charterhouse, with Saint Thomas, Charterhouse, in the said County and Diocese, have been united into one Benefice (hereinafter called ‘ the said United Benefice ’) and it is by the same Order provided amongst other things (1) that an ecclesiastical district shall be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church shall be built out of the net proceeds of the sale or sales of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Paul, Bunhill Row, Finsbury, (2) that when a Church for such District has been built it shall be dedicated to Saint Paul and that the patronage thereof shall be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being, and (3) that a sum of £235 per annum being part of a larger annual sum formerly payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Paul, Bunhill Row, Finsbury, shall be held and applied by us for the endowment of such Church and District, provided that until the avoidance of the said United Benefice by the Reverend Arthur Tildesley the

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £115 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £115 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Ruislip which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of ‘ The District of Saint Paul, Ruislip Manor ’.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council dated the 17th day of March, 1932, be vested in and exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
