

"And whereas the said United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, is now full, the Reverend John William Lamb being the present Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said William, Archbishop of York, and John William Lamb (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme, the Parishes of the said United Benefice of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, with York, Saint Michael, Spurriergate, shall be permanently united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of York, Saint Mary, Castlegate, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Michael, Spurriergate, York, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of April, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the eleventh Section of that Measure with reference to the Church of Saint Mary, Magdalene, situate within the Parish of the United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Mary Major with Saint George, Saint John and Saint Petrock, in the City and the County of the City of Exeter and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 5th day of October, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month (hereinafter referred to as the original Order) provision was made (*inter alia*) for the union of the Benefice and Parish (containing the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene) of Exeter, Saint Mary Major, the United Benefice and Parishes of Exeter, Saint John with Saint George, and a part of the United Benefice and Parishes of Exeter, Saint Kerrian with Saint Petrock:

"And whereas the said union has since taken effect:

"And whereas by the original Order in Council authority was given for the appropriation of the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene as a Parish Hall but such appropriation has not yet been made effective by the execution of a Deed of Trust pursuant to Section 24 of the said Measure:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene should not be appropriated as a Parish Hall as aforesaid but that it should be taken down and the materials and site thereof should be sold, the net proceeds of such sale being applied as is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Mary Magdalene has ceased to be used and is no longer required for purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he
