Madrid, Sept. 17. N. S.

HE King of Spain's Health is confiderably mended fince his last Illness; He goes abroad every Evening to take the Air. On the 11th of this Month he gave Audience of Leave to the Count de Harrach, Ambassador from the Emperor, who is on his Departure home; the Count de Harrach, his Son, being already arriv'd, to succeed him with the same Character. And on the 15th, the French Ambassador made his Entry, and had Publick Audience of His Catholick Majesty with the usual Ceremonies. The Royal Regiment of Horse, which was commanded by the Prince of Hesse Darmstadt, is now divided into two Squadrons or Regiments; of which, two of the for-mer Captains are made Colonels, and the King has given a Commission to the Almirante of Galtille to command them in Chief, independant of any other General Officers; They are to be quartered in and about Madrid; And here is a talk of raising another Regiment of Horse, and some Regiments of Foot, to be likewise under the Almirante's Orders. The Count d'Ursel, who was Lieutenant-Colonel of the faid Regiment, ismade Master de Camp-General, and the King has granted him a Pension of 3000 Pieces of Eight out of the Customs on Tobacco. We have an Account from Cadiz, that the French Men of War continue in that Port, and 'tis believed they have Orders to Winter there, the Count d'Estrees. who Commands them, having defired that two Store-houses might be allowed for his Magazines at Port St. Maries, and having given Directions for hiring a House for himself in the Isle of Leon. By some Ships arrived at Cadiz from the Mef-Indies, which passed by the Havana in the Month of June last, we have Advice, that the Flora, which is expected home, was not yet come to that Port, so that it's thought they will not arrive so soon as was expected. The Letters from Malaga say, that the two French Men of War, which have cruized some time off of that Port, were under fail in order to join Monsieur d'Estrees, but upon the Receipt of further Orders from him,

they returned to their former Stations.

Limberg, Sep. 12. The King of Poland went from hence yesterday to his Army, and intends, as soon as they are joined with the Forces of the Crown, to march towards Gaminice, near which place 30000 Tartars are drawn together; part of them have made an Excursion towards Bred, and deseated one of our Parties of about 100 Men who were sent our against the Enemy, but in too small a Number to oppose them, carrying off a great Booty. We have Advice, that the Muscovites having crossed an Arm of the Black Sea, are entred into the Country of the Tartars called

the Crimea, and made an Irruption as far as Caffa. They write from Moscow of the 5th Instant, that the Czar, with General Le Fore and the rest of his Retinue, are arrived there.

Vienna, Sept. 20. The Imperial Court continues at Eberfliorf, where the Count of Metternick has, in the Name of the Prince of Lorraine Bishop of Olmutz, received from the Emperor the Inveffiture of the Bishoprick of Osnabrug, to which he was Elected some time ago. Orders are sent to the Emperor's Commissioners in Hungary to return hither, and the States of that Kingdom have a for been directed to fend Deputies to this Court, to confer with the Emperor's Ministers about several Matters relating to that Country. The Emperor's Plenipotentiaries for the Treaty of Peace with the Turks, design to be going from hence in 2 or 3 days to the Place of Treaty, together with the Ambaffador of Mufcovy, who has received Orders from the Czar his Master to accompany them; and the Venetian Ambassador stays only for his Collegue, Signior Molinos, intending, as foon as he arrives, to repair likewife to the Frontiers, where the Congress is to be held. Letters from the Imperial Camp in Hangary of the 11th Instant say, Prince Eugene of Savoy having given the necessary Orders for securing the Communication between the Army and Peter-Waradin, Titul, and Sablia, marched on the 10th of this Month to the Camp that was marked out near Berzkerk. They had received Advice, that the Turkish Army was marched from Simendria to Wichnizza, neater to Belgrade; that the Detachment of Turks and Tartars which had passed the Danube on their Bridge of Boats near Bancona, was returned to join the Army; And it was fild, the Visier intended to send a Detachment towards

Berlin, sept. 27. The Elector of Brandenburgh is gone to pass a few days at his House at Neuhausfen. The Sieur Ablefeldt, Envoy from Dinmark, has had several Conserences with Monsieur Fuchs and Monsieur Smittan, Commissioners from his Electoral Highness, for adjusting the Assairs of Holstein. Monsieur Viereck is expected here the next week from Prussa; he was Receiver-General there, and is now appointed Envoy to the Court of Denmark, in the Room of Monsieur Falaiseau. Monsieur Ruswitz, the Envoy of Poland, went from hence yesterday for Saxony. Monsieur Urlick, the Danish Resident at Vienna, is come historia his way to Copenhag n.

Iransfort, Sept. 28. The Elector Palatine continues here, and the Landgrave of Heffe Darmfadt, the Prince of Hemburg, and the Count of Nassau Weilburg, are likewise come hither. Prince Lewis of Baden, who has been sometime at Rastar, is gone to Wirtemberg, that he may be nearer to Brisa: when the French shall evacuate that Place, which they have promited to do very speedi'y.

Hamburgh , Sept. 30 The Count de Welling, who is appointed by the King of Smeden to refide as his Ambaliador at the Court of Poland, arrived here last Saturday, and intends, after a stry of 3 or 4 Weeks at this Place, to continue his Journey to Peland. We have an Account from the Dutchy of Haldein, that the Duke of Helftein is arrived there with his Princess from Sueden. Our last Advices from Lemberg say, the King of Poland was marching with his German Forces, confifting in 22000 Men and 24 Field-Pieces, towards Caminice, and was advanced as far as Giniarow; That the Army of the Crown with 40 Pieces of Cannon marched likewife to join him, and that 'twas thought the King defigned to attack the Tartars who are drawn together near Caminice, and have fent out divers Parties to make Excursions on our Frontiers. Some of the Enemy who were taken Priloners report, that they are not above 32000 strong, and did not expect the Forces of Poland were to numerous as they find them.
