Madrid, Sept. 17. N. S.

THE King of Spain's Health is considerably mended since his last Illness; He goes abroad every Evening to take the Air. On the 11th of this Month he gave Audience of Leave to the Count de Harrach, Ambassador from the Emperor, who is on his Departure home; the Count de Harrach, his Son, being already arriv'd, to succeed him with the same Character. And on the 15th, the French Ambassador made his Entry, and had Publick Audience of His Catholick Majesty with the usual Ceremonies. The Royal Regiment of Horse, which was commanded by the Prince of Hesse Darmstadt, is now divided into two Squadrons or Regiments; of which, two of the former Captains are made Colonels, and the King has given a Commission to the Almirante of Castille to command them in Chief, independant of any other General Officers; They are to be quartered in and about Madrid; And here is a talk of raising another Regiment of Horse, and some Regiments of Foot, to be likewise under the Almirante's Orders. The Count d'Urzel, who was Lieutenant-Colonel of the said Regiment, is made Master de Camp-General, and the King has granted him a Pension of 3000 Pieces of Eight out of the Customs on Tobacco. We have an Account from Cadix, that the French Men of War continue in that Port, and 'tis believed they have Orders to Winter there, the Count d'Estrees, who Commands them, having desired that two Store-houses might be allowed for his Magazines at Port St. Maries, and having given Directions for hiring a House for himself in the Isle of Leon. By some Ships arrived at Cadix from the West-Indies, which passed by the Havana in the Month of June last, we have Advice, that the *Flora*, which is expected home, was not yet come to that Port, so that it's thought they will not arrive so soon as was expected. The Letters from Malaga say, that the two French Men of War, which have cruized some time off of that Port, were under sail in order to join Monsieur d'Estrees, but upon the Receipt of further Orders from him, they returned to their former Stations.

Lemberg, Sept. 12. The King of Poland went from hence yesterday to his Army, and intends, as soon as they are joined with the Forces of the Crown, to march towards Caminice, near which place 30000 Tartars are drawn together; part of them have made an Excursion towards Bresl, and defeated one of our Parties of about 100 Men who were sent out against the Enemy, but in too small a Number to oppose them, carrying off a great Booty. We have Advice, that the Muscovites having crossed an Arm of the Black Sea, are entered into the Country of the Tartars called

the Crimea, and made an Irruption as far as Caffa. They write from Moscow of the 5th Instant, that the Czar, with General Le Fort and the rest of his Retinue, are arrived there.

Vienna, Sept. 20. The Imperial Court continues at Ebersdorf, where the Count of Metternich has, in the Name of the Prince of Lorraine Bishop of Osnabruck, received from the Emperor the Investiture of the Bishoprick of Osnabruck, to which he was Elected some time ago. Orders are sent to the Emperor's Commissioners in Hungary to return hither, and the States of that Kingdom have also been directed to send Deputies to this Court, to confer with the Emperor's Ministers about several Matters relating to that Country. The Emperor's Plenipotentiaries for the Treaty of Peace with the Turks, design to be going from hence in 2 or 3 days to the Place of Treaty, together with the Ambassador of Muscovy, who has received Orders from the Czar his Master to accompany them; and the Venetian Ambassador stays only for his Collegue, Signior Molinos, intending, as soon as he arrives, to repair likewise to the Frontiers, where the Congress is to be held. Letters from the Imperial Camp in Hungary of the 11th Instant say, Prince Eugene of Savoy having given the necessary Orders for securing the Communication between the Army and Peter-Waradin, Titul, and Sablia, marched on the 10th of this Month to the Camp that was marked out near Berzkerk. They had received Advice, that the Turkish Army was marched from S. mendria to Wichnizza, nearer to Belgrade; that the Detachment of Turks and Tartars which had passed the Danube on their Bridge of Boats near Banzona, was returned to join the Army; And it was said, the Visier intended to send a Detachment towards Besna, to make a Diversion on that side.

Berlin, Sept. 27. The Elector of Brandenburg is gone to pass a few days at his House at Neubausen. The Sieur Ablefeldt, Envoy from Denmark, has had several Conferences with Monsieur Fuchs and Monsieur Smittaz, Commissioners from his Electoral Highness, for adjusting the Affairs of Holstein. Monsieur Viereck is expected here the next week from Prussia; he was Receiver-General there, and is now appointed Envoy to the Court of Denmark, in the Room of Monsieur Falaiseau. Monsieur Rujwitz, the Envoy of Poland, went from hence yesterday for Saxony. Monsieur Urtlick, the Danish Resident at Vienna, is come hither in his way to Copenhagen.

Frankfort, Sept. 28. The Elector Palatine continues here, and the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt, the Prince of Hembourg, and the Count of Nassau Weilburg, are likewise come hither. Prince Lewis of Baden, who has been some time at Rastat, is gone to Wirtemberg, that he may be nearer to Brisac when the French shall evacuate that Place, which they have promised to do very speedily.

Hamburg, Sept. 30 The Count de *Willing*, who is appointed by the King of *Sweden* to reside as his Ambassador at the Court of *Poland*, arrived here last Saturday, and intends, after a stay of 3 or 4 Weeks at this Place, to continue his Journey to *Poland*. We have an Account from the Dutchy of *Hildesheim*, that the Duke of *Holftein* is arrived there with his Princess from *Sweden*. Our last Advices from *Lemberg* say, the King of *Poland* was marching with his German Forces, consisting in 22000 Men and 24 Field-Pieces, towards *Cominick*, and was advanced as far as *Gomiarow*; That the Army of the Crown with 40 Pieces of Cannon marched likewise to join him, and that 'twas thought the King designed to attack the Tartars who are drawn together near *Cominick*, and have sent out divers Parties to make Excursions on our Frontiers. Some of the Enemy who were taken Prisoners report, that they are not above 32000 strong, and did not expect the Forces of *Poland* were so numerous as they find them. The *Palatine of Posen*, Plenipotentiary of that Crown for the Treaty of Peace with the Turks, began his Journey to *Hungary* on the 10th of this Month.

Brussels, Octob. 1. The Elector of *Bavaria* is gone to Hunt near *Mons*, and is expected back to-morrow. The Baron of *Itre* has received Orders to go with the Character of Envoy to *Paris*, to take care of the Affairs of *Spain* at that Court till the Arrival of the Spanish Ambassador, and is preparing for his Journey thither. They write from *Liffe*, that the French have demanded an extraordinary Supply of 300000 Florins from that City and its Dependencies.

Hague, Octob. 3. The King went from *Loo* last Tuesday morning, being the 30th of the last Month; His Majesty intended to lie that night at *Lingen*, and to be this day at the *Gour*, the Duke of *Cels*'s Hunting-house. The Heer *Rosemael*, one of the Dutch Commissioners at the French Court for settling the *Tariffe*, and other Matters of Trade between the two Nations, arrived here yesterday from *Paris*, to give an Account to the States-General of their Proceedings in this Affair, in which we do not hear that they have made any Progress, though they have had divers Conferences with the French Commissioners. The Electress of *Bavaria* went from hence yesterday for *Brussels*. The Commissioners who were sent by the States to view the Fortifications of the City of *Groninghen*, are come back to make their Report. The Baron de *Lillivoor* is expected here again from *Stockholm* with the Character he had formerly, of Ambassador from the King of *Sweden*.

Paris, Octob. 4. N. S. The King went the 2d of this Month to *Fonsainbleau*, where the Court will continue some time. The Ceremony of *Mademoiselle's* Marriage with the Duke of *Lorraine* continues fixed for the 12th of this Month, and the Duke d'*Elbeuf* is appointed by that Prince to be his Proxy. He is to accompany her to *Nancy*, with the Count d'*Armagnac*, the Chevalier de *Lorraine*, the Count de *Marfan*, and the Prince d'*Harcourt*, being all Princes of the House of *Lorraine*; Great Preparations are making at *Nancy* for her Reception, and the Duke has sent her a Present in Jewels of the Value of above 100000 Crowns.

London, Sept. 20. Yesterday was Launched at Mr. *Snelgrove's* Yard at *Deptford*, a new Third-Rate Ship of 70 Guns, named the *Orford*, built by Mr. *Snelgrove*.

Westminster, Septemb. 27. The Parliament met this day, and was further Prorogued to the 27th day of *October* next.
