(b) Male young persons over 16 years of age in testing wash-mill samples in the laboratory at the works of The Alpha Cement Ltd., Cliffeat-Hoo, near Rochester, subject to a condition as to weekly alternation of shifts.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS ACT, 1933.

NATIONAL CHILDREN'S HOME SCHOOL, PENARTH, GLAMORGAN.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that he has issued a Certificate of Approval under the provisions of the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, for the National Children's Home School, Penarth, Glamorgan, with a view to the education and training of boys sent thereto in pursuance of the said Act.

The Certificate, which bears date the 1st July, provides that the number of boys resident in the School at any one time shall not exceed One hundred and twelve.
