ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 29th September, 1936.)

Whereas by declaration issued by the Minister of Health under the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 145 of the Local Government Act, 1933, part of the parish of Woodcote included in the Newport sub-district of the Wellington registration district was on the 21st August, 1936, transferred to the parish of Gnosall and from the Administrative County of Stafford, and part of the parish of Gnosall included in the Gnosall sub-district of the Stafford registration district was on the same date transferred to the parish of Woodcote and from the Administrative County of Stafford to the Administrative County of Stafford to the Administrative County of Stafford to the Administrative County of Salop;

And whereas it is expedient that the Wellington registration district should be wholly comprised within the Administrative County of Salop, and that the Stafford registration district should be wholly comprised within the Administrative County of Stafford;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and

sanction of the said Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Shropshire and Staffordshire Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1936, and shall come into operation on the 12th day of October, 1936.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district and the terms "existing district" and "existing subdistrict" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 12th day of October, 1936.

2.—(1) That portion of the existing Wellington district which consists of part of the parish of Gnosall shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the Stafford district.

(2) That portion of the existing Stafford district which consists of part of the parish of Woodcote shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the Wellington district.

3.—(1) That portion of the parish of Gnosall included in the existing Newport sub-district shall be added to and form part of the Gnosall sub-district.

(2) That portion of the parish of Woodcote included in the existing Gnosall sub-district shall be added to and form part of the Newport sub-district.

4. The Superintendent Registrars of the existing Wellington and Stafford districts shall respectively be the Superintendent Registrars of those districts as altered by this Order.

5. The Registrars of Births and Deaths of the existing Newport and Gnosall sub-districts shall respectively be the Registrars of Births and Deaths of those sub-districts as altered by this Order.
