

in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter III:

"And whereas the said yearly rentcharge of £100 has been granted by the said Robert William Stannard as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Robert William Stannard has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Durham as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Nicholas, Bishopwearmouth.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Herbert Hensley, Bishop of the said Diocese of Durham, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Nicholas, Bishopwearmouth, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Bishopwearmouth, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Christ Church,

Bishopwearmouth, upon the south and upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Silksworth, upon the north-west by the New Parish of South Hylton, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Hilda, Millfield, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Millfield, from the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, at the junction of Durham Road with Otto Terrace, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Otto Terrace for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thorneholme Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Thorneholme Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate at the western end of the road called Thornhill Park, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 1, Thornhill Gardens, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Thornhill Gardens, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Thornhill Gardens for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brookside Gardens, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Brookside Gardens for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past the southern side of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Thornhill Gardens, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tunstall Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Bishopwearmouth out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.
