Whitehall, 11th November, 1936. The KING has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto John Maurice FitzRoy, of Eaton Terrace, in the City of Westminster, Esquire, Lieutenant Commander in the Royal Navy (retired), and Lucia Charlotte Susan, his Wife, elder Daughter and co-heir of Sir Francis Alexander Newdigate-Newdegate, late of Arbury Manor, in the County of Warwick, and of Harefield Grove, Uxbridge, in the County of Middlesex, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, His Royal Licence and Authority that they make take and use the surname of Newdegate in addition to and after that of FitzRoy, that he the said John Maurice FitzRoy may bear the Arms of New-degate quarterly in the first quarter with those of FitzRoy and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken borne and used by the issue of their marriage: the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to Command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms. (292)
