7. Candidates must take up subject 8 European History, Period 3, subject 67 French Language, subject 70 German Language, and must reach a high standard of qualification in subject 67. They must also take either subject 26 General Economics or subject 3 Elementary Economics, but they may not take both

8. In Section B a candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds 1,300 marks (or 1,350 marks if Russian Language be selected) must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 1,300 (or 1,350). This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can make the reduction by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.

9. The following restrictions apply to particular subjects in Section B.

Greek Literature (60) may be taken only by candidates who offer Greek Translation (57), and Latin Literature (64) only by those who offer Latin Translation (61).

In subjects 69 to 78 the literature paper, and in subjects 79 to 84 the history or literature paper, may be taken only by candidates who take the corresponding language.

10. A candidate desiring to offer Experimental Psychology (22), or any of the subjects
