RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiry of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act to make the "London Traffic (Parking Places) (Amendment) No. 4 Regulations, 1937":—

1. To abolish the existing parking places in the undermentioned streets:—

Borough of Ealing:—St. James's Avenue and Talbot Road.

2. To amend the limits of the existing parking places in the undermentioned streets:—

Borough of Bromley:—Elmfield Road, Ethelbert Road, Ravensbourne Road.

3. To authorise parking places in the undermentioned streets:—

Borough of Bromley:—Ringers Road.

Borough of Ilford:—Roden Street.

Borough of Richmond:—West of Kew Bridge Approach.

Borough of Watford:—Gammons Lane, Park Road, The Avenue, Church Street, St. Mary's Road, Smith Street and Granville Road.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*River Ouse (Yorks) Catchment Board.**Ainsty Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Order made on the 17th December, 1936, in relation to the Scheme prepared by the River Ouse (Yorks) Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, for the constitution of the Ainsty Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor, and for certain matters supplemental thereto.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
