

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship :

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors :

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111 :

“ And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,100 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church :

“ And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said sum of £1,100 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth :

“ And whereas the contributors of the purchase money for the said plot of land and of the said sum of £1,100 have nominated to us the Bishop of Chichester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be assigned :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, now Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Ovingdean, of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Kemp Town, and of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Cuthman, Whitehawk.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish,

and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Cuthman, Whitehawk, comprising :—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Ovingdean, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the north partly by the Parish of Falmer and partly by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Moulsecoomb, upon the west partly by the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, and partly by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Kemp Town, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Kemp Town, from the said Parish of Ovingdean, at the junction of Whitehawk Road with Henley Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Henley Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wilson Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wilson Avenue for a distance of 1 mile and 15 chains or thereabouts to a point near its junction with Warren Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ovingdean from the said Parish of Falmer.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, which is bounded upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Ovingdean, upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Kemp Town, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Brighton, upon part of the west by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Brighton, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Brighton, from the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, at the junction of Pankhurst Avenue with Freshfield Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Freshfield Road for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Warren Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Warren Road for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Wilfrid, Brighton, from the said Parish of Ovingdean.
