WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts", and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of December, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts', and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Cranford, in the County of Northampton and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Cranford has been improved under and by virtue of certain leases which have been granted under the authority of the said Acts and which include a lease (hereinafter referred to as the existing lease) dated the 15th day of July, 1920, and a supplemental lease dated the 13th day of March, 1930, of certain minerals, that is to say, the beds or seams of ironstone or iron-ore, greenstone, limestone, building stone, and sand in and under parts of the glebe lands of the said Benefice, which existing lease and supplemental lease were granted with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the present Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cranford:
