Rome, Sept. 30. N. S.

ON the 25th Instant the Pope held a Confistory, and confirmed the Choice made by the Chapter of *Ratisbonne*, of the Elector of *Cologne* to be their Bishop. The Divines appointed by the Pope to examine the Archbishop of *Gambroy's* Book, have delivered their Opinions in Writing to the Pope, who has ordered the same to be further considered by the Cardinals of the Congregation of the Inquisition, in order to the terminating this Affair, for which the French Court make very pressing Instances. We have received Advice, that the Pope's Galleys arrived the 11th Instant at the Isle of *Corfu* in their return from the *Levant*.

Leghorne, Octob. 6. This week came in here the *Dru*, laden with Hides from *Archangel*; as also the *Revenge* Galley, Captain *William Poulgreen*, and the *Poplar* Frigate, Captain *Wilmot*, both bound for *Gallipoli*; The *Diana*, Captain *Parker*, is taking in Goods at this place for *England*.

Genova, Octob. 7. Last week came in here two Merchant-men with a considerable quantity of Silver from *Cadiz*. They write from *Milan*, that the Prince of *Vaudemont*, Governor of the *Milaneze*, was returned from the Baths of *Aiqui* in *Mountferret*, where he had been for the Recovery of his Health; And that Ambassadors were shortly expected there from the Cantons of *Switzerland*, to make him the Compliments usually paid by those Cantons to every new Governor of *Milan*.

Venice, Octob. 18. Signior *Aluizo Pisani*, who is appointed by the Senate to reside at the French Court as Ambassador from this Republick, is preparing for his Journey thither, which he intends to begin in a few days. Yesterday came in here a Ship in 40 days from *Constantinople*, the Master of which gives an Account, that the same day he came through the *Dardanelles*, he had sight of the Venetian Men of War commanded by Signior *Delfino*, who were cruising off the Isle of *Imbro*, as likewise of the Enemies Fleet, which lay at Anchor without the *Streights* Mouth near the Isle of *Tenedos*; Captain-General *Cornaro* with the Venetian Galleys was sailed to *Porto-Parro*, after having attempted several times to engage the Enemy, who always avoided it. The Pope's and the Maltese Galleys are returning home, and a Vessel is arrived here, who left them the 6th of the last Month at the Isle of *Zans*. Our freshest Letters from *Dalmatia* say, the Venetian Forces continue on the Frontiers of that Province to observe the Turks, who had gathered some Troops together in *Bisnia* with a design, as 'twas thought, to make

an Incurfion into the Venetian Territories. They write from *Constantinople* of the 4th of September, that they had received Advice, that the *Muscovites* had made a great Irruption in *Tartary*; and that the *Cossacks* had taken from the Turks divers small Vessels in the *Black Sea*.

Cadiz, Sept. 29. The *Poole* and *Betty* Men of War came in here the 10th Instant from cruising on the Coasts of *Sallee*, and the 20th they returned to their Stations. The 16th, a French Man of War arrived here from the *Levant*; and the 20th, another from the *Canaries*. This day 7 Ships of the Count *d'Estree's* Squadron sailed out of this Bay for *Thoulon*; and it's said, the Count *d'Estree* will follow with the rest of the French Men of War in 2 or 3 days.

Warsaw, Octob. 10. Our last Letters from *Lemberg* give an Account, that the King of *Poland* was returned thither, and would shortly assemble his Council; after which he intended to march to *Lithuania* with 10000 Men, and the rest of his Forces are going into Winter-Quarters. He has sent Circular Letters to the Gentlemen of *Lithuania*, wherein he forbids their Meeting at *Grodno* according to what they resolved in their last Assembly at *Wilda*, but we do not yet hear what Effect they have had.

From the Imperial Camp near *Berzkerk*, Octob. 8. On the 30th of September Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy* received Advice from General *Spielberg*, whom he had sent with a Detachment of Horse towards *Tirul*, that the day before he was informed, that 18 Turkish Saicks were passing up the *Danube* towards *Salankemen*, and that as he marched along the Banks of that River, he had seen a great number of their Vessels sailing the same way, which he judged to be the rest of their Fleet; but we are since told, that they are all returned to *Belgrade*, except 6 or 7 of them which lie at the Isle of *Penizia* near *Salankemen*. The first Instant the *Sieur Beferti*, a Colonel of the Artillery, was detached from the Camp with a Body of Dragoons, and ordered to march to *Croatia*; and yesterday a Regiment was ordered to go with Fascines to repair the Ways to *Sablja*, which are very much spoiled by the late Rains. This day we have received Advice, that a considerable Convoy of Provisions from *Belgrade* is arrived at *Temeswaer* under a Guard of 12000 Horse and some Regiments of *Janizaries*, who having crossed the *Danube* at *Banzoua*, took their March on the other side the *Temes*, which is so swelled by the Rains, that it was impossible for the Detachments which the Prince of *Savoy* had sent out to intercept this Convoy, to pass over the River to attack them. The Grand *Vissier* continues encamped along the *Save* near *Belgrade*.

Venna, Octob. 13. The Imperial Court continues at Ebersdorf, but will return hither in a few days. Signior Paulucci, the Pope's Nuncio Extraordinary, has had divers Conferences with the Emperor's Ministers, touching the Fiefs in the Ecclesiastical State which the Emperor lays claim to, and so soon as he has adjusted these Matters, he will return to Rome.

Francfort, Octob. 18. The Elector Palatine is returned from Schwerzingen to Weynheim, and intends in a few days to visit his Territories along the Rhine. The French Commissioners for adjusting the Pretensions of the Dutchess of Orleans upon the Palatinate are shortly expected here, some of their Servants being already arrived. They write from Mentz, That the Commander of that Garrison has taken a Review of the same, and that a very severe Order has been published there for punishing Deserters. The Elector of Mentz is expected there in a short time from Aschaffembourg.

Hambourg, Octob. 21. This day the Commissioners from the Directors of the Circle of the Lower Saxony, met at the House of Count d'Eck, who resides here on the part of the Emperor, to enquire into the Pretensions of the Dukes of Schwerin and Strelitz to the Succession of the late Duke of Mecklembourg Gustrau, who died without Heirs; and after they have finished this Affair, they intend to proceed on that of enquiring into the Disorders of this City, pursuant to the Commission they have from the Emperor in that behalf. The Burghers seem much concerned at it, and yesterday assembled about Noon, and sat till 4 this Morning, when they adjourned for 3 weeks, having renewed their former Resolution, not to submit to this Commission, which they look upon as prejudicial to their Rights and Liberties. They write from Copenhagen, that Monsieur Ehrencron is gone from thence for Madrid, being appointed by the King of Denmark to be his Envoy Extraordinary at that Court. The Count de Mellin, whom the King of Sweden has lately made Governor of Pomeran, took possession of that Government, and made his Publick Entry at Srettin the first Instant. We have Advice from Berlin, that Mr. Stepney, His Majesty of Great-Britain's Envoy Extraordinary to the Elector of Brandenburg, is returned thither from the Court, where he has been to wait on the King his Master. Our last Letters from Poland say, the Forces of that Kingdom are going into Winter-Quarters, except 10000 Germans who are ordered to march into Lithuania, and that the King of Poland was returned to Lemberg, (where his Council had been several times assembled,) and was preparing for his Journey to Grodna, to prevent the intended Meeting of the Gentlemen of Lithuania in that City which might be of ill consequence at this time, and to settle the Affairs of that Dutchy. The Queen-Dowager of Poland, and Prince Constantine her Son, are gone from Javarow on their Journey for Rome.

Paris, Octob. 30. N. S. The Court is still at Fousainbleau, where 'tis said they will continue till the 13th of the next Month. The Dutchess of Lorraine arrived the 24th Instant at St. Dizier, and intended to go from thence the 25th to Sermaize, on the Frontier of the Dutchy of Barr, where the Duke her Husband would meet her. Some Merchants have petitioned to be Incorporated

in a Company to Trade to the Coast of Guinea, which is under Consideration.

The Post from Holland of Tuesday last is not yet come in.
