BERKS, BUCKS AND OXON JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT 1930: SECTION 3.

89,855. (15th March, 1937.)

Whereas by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930 (in this order referred to as "the principal order") as amended by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March 1937 for the combination of the administrative counties of Berks, Buckingham and Oxford and the county boroughs of Oxford and Reading for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a joint committee named the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1937.

(2) The principal order amended as aforesaid and this order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders 1930 to 1937.

2. The principal order amended as aforesaid shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1938 unless sooner revoked or otherwise amended.

CHESHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

89229 (12th March, 1937.)

Whereas by the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order 1930, as amended by the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order, 1936, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March 1937 for the combination of the county of Chester and the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Chester, Stockport and Wallasey for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a Joint Committee named the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as hereinafter provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Cheshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1937, shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1937, and shall continue in operation for a period of seven years:

Provided that for the purposes of the election of members of the Joint Committee and proceedings relating thereto this order shall operate from such date earlier than the first day of April, 1937, as may be necessary.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

"the combined areas" means the county and county boroughs for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

"The Joint Committee" means the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee constituted under the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order 1930 and renamed by this Order;

"council" means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and "councils" means the councils of the county and all the county boroughs so included;

"casual" means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

"casual ward" means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

"the Minister" means the Minister of Health.
