The Importation of Plants (Amendment) Order
of 1937.

This Order prohibits the landing in England or Wales from any country other than Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands of any living Chrysanthemum plant and parts thereof (except seeds) for planting, except under licence from the Ministry, and requires the certificates prescribed in Article 4 of the Importation of Plants Order of 1933, except in the case of a consignment consisting wholly of potatoes, to include a statement that the consignment does not contain any Chrysanthemum plant.
