INCOME TAX.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL  
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 17th March, 1937.)

Whereas the registration district of Bury is now co-extensive with the County Borough of Bury;

And whereas the boundaries of the County Borough of Bury will on the 1st day of April, 1937, by virtue of the provisions of the County of Lancaster and County Borough of Bury (Alteration of Boundaries) Order, 1937, be altered in such a way that the said County Borough will no longer be entirely situate in the registration district of Bury;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid registration district should continue to be co-extensive with the County Borough of Bury;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction

of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Lancaster and County Borough of Bury Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1937.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing sub-district" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of April, 1937.

2. That portion of the existing Heywood district consisting of part of the parish of Whitefield which will, by virtue of the County of Lancaster and County Borough of Bury (Alteration of Boundaries) Order, 1937, be included in the County Borough of Bury, shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Bury district.

3. The area added to the Bury district by Article 2 of this Order shall cease to be included in the Radcliffe sub-district and shall be added to and form part of the Bury sub-district.

4. The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Bury district shall be the Superintendent Registrar of that district as extended by this Order.

5. The Registrar of Births and Deaths of the existing Bury sub-district shall be the Registrar of Births and Deaths of that sub-district as extended by this Order.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL  
IN ENGLAND.

Whereas the boundaries of the parish of Hailsham now situate in the Hailsham North sub-district of the Hailsham Registration District will on the 1st day of April, 1937, by virtue of the provisions of the County of Sussex East (Hailsham, Jevington and Willingdon Parishes) Confirmation Order, 1937, be altered in such a way that the aforementioned parish will be situate partly in the Hailsham North sub-district and partly in the Hailsham South sub-district;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid sub-districts should continue to be constituted of entire parishes;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—
