PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of the Medical Act, 1886, it is provided (amongst other things) that His Majesty may, from time to time, by Order in Council, declare that the Second Part of the said Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such Order, to apply to any British Possession which in the opinion of His Majesty affords to the Registered Medical Practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British Possession as to His Majesty may seem just; and that from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British Possession shall be deemed to be a British Possession to which the said Act applies, within the meaning of the Second Part thereof, and that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British Possession the said Second Part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such Possession:

And whereas on the 9th day of May, 1892, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council was pleased to declare that on and after the 1st day of July, 1892, the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, should be deemed to apply to India:

And whereas on the commencement of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935, Burma will cease to be part of India in accordance with the provision of sub-section (2) of

section forty-six of that Act, and the day fixed by His Majesty in Council for the commencement of the said Part III of the said Government of India Act is the 1st day of April, 1937:

And whereas from the said 1st day of April, 1937, Burma will be a British Possession within the meaning of the said Medical Act and in the opinion of His Majesty will afford to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in Burma as to His Majesty seem just:

Now, therefore, His Majesty doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and declare that, on and after the 1st day of April, 1937, the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be deemed to apply to Burma.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the proviso to subsection (1) of section two of the Government of India Act, 1935, it is provided that any powers connected with the exercise of the functions of the Crown in its relation with Indian States shall, in India, if not exercised by His Majesty, be exercised only by, or by persons acting under the authority of, His Majesty's Representative for the exercise of those functions of the Crown:

And whereas provision is made by the said Act and the Government of Burma Act, 1935,

as to the authorities which are respectively to exercise on behalf of His Majesty the rights, authority and jurisdiction of His Majesty in, and in relation to, the tribal areas in India, and in, and in relation to, areas in Burma which are not part of the territories of His Majesty:

And whereas it is accordingly expedient to amend the Indian (Foreign Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1902, (in this Order referred to as "the principal Order"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Indian (Foreign Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1937.

2.—(1) As from the commencement of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935, the powers conferred by the principal Order on the Governor-General in Council shall, so far as they are connected with the exercise of the functions of the Crown in its relations with Indian States, be powers of His Majesty's Representative for the exercise of those functions of the Crown, and he may delegate those powers to such extent and in such manner as he thinks fit.

(2) The person appointed to be His Majesty's Representative for the exercise of those functions of the Crown may, before the commencement of Part III of the said Act, make any rules, orders, delegations and appointments and issue any other instruments which he would have power to make or issue after the commencement of Part III of the said Act, but no such rule, order, delegation or appointment shall come into force until the commencement of Part III of the said Act.

(3) Orders and other Instruments made and executed in the name of the Crown Representative shall be authenticated in such manner as may be specified in the Rules to be made by him and the validity of an Order or Instrument which is so authenticated shall not be called in question on the ground that it is not an Order or Instrument made by the Crown Representative.

3. As from the commencement of Part III of the said Act and the Government of Burma Act, 1935, the principal Order shall cease to have effect as respects the tribal areas in India and any areas in Burma, without prejudice, however, to the validity of anything previously done thereunder:

Provided that any rules, orders, delegations, appointments or other instruments made or issued under the said Order shall continue in force, except so far as revoked or varied by the authority competent for the purpose under the Government of India Act, 1935, or the Government of Burma Act, 1935, as the case may be.

4. Save as aforesaid, the powers conferred by the principal Order on the Governor-General in Council shall continue to be exercisable on behalf of His Majesty by the Governor-General in Council until the establishment of the Federation of India and shall thereupon become exercisable on behalf of His Majesty by the Governor-General of India.

5. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the construction of this Order.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as modified by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, and by Article 2 of the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty The King may, by Order in Council, apply that Section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the Law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death, or that the Law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Law of the Colony of British Honduras as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of subsection (1) of the aforesaid Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be applied to the said Colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to the Colony of British Honduras as from the twenty-sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-five.

And the Right Honourable William Ormsby-Gore, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

EX-PARTE THE PRESIDENT AND FELLOWS OF SAINT JOHN BAPTIST COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

A STATUTE made to amend a Statute framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 and 14 Geo. 5 Ch. 33) in relation to Saint John Baptist College in the University of Oxford duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the third day of February one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven under Section 7 (2) of the said Act by the votes of not less than

two-thirds of the number of the persons present and voting and approved by Congregation of the University on the twenty-third day of February one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the said Act and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas Statute XX of the Statutes of the said College consisting of eleven clauses deals with the Disposal of Revenue:

And whereas it appears to us the President and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that Statute XX of the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now We the President and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of Section 7 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 do by this present instrument under our Seal alter and amend Clause 2 of Statute XX of the said College by substituting "£750" for "£450" as being payable by the said College towards the stipend of the Laudian Professor of Arabic.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th April, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th April, 1937, to Saturday, the 17th April, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even

multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY minimum rate of wages for male and female workers at present set out in the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (34) dated 18th January, 1935, and the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (36) dated 12th February, 1936.

#### ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

Whereas the Superintendent Registrars' districts in the Administrative County of Somerset now consist of areas situate entirely within that County; and no part of that County is comprised within any other Superintendent Registrar's district, and the Superintendent Registrars' districts in the Administrative County of Wilts now consist of areas situate entirely within that County;

And whereas the boundaries of the Administrative Counties of Somerset and Wilts will on the 1st day of April, 1937, by virtue of the provisions of the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Somerset and Wilts) Act, 1937, be altered whereby the Superintendent Registrar's district of Warminster now in the Administrative County of Wilts will comprise an area added by that Act to the Administrative County of Somerset;

And whereas it is expedient that the Superintendent Registrars' districts in the Administrative County of Somerset should continue to comprise all the areas situate within that County, and that the Superintendent Registrars' districts in the Administrative County of Wilts should continue to comprise all the areas situate within that County and no others;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Somerset and Wilts Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1937.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing sub-

district" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of April, 1937.

2. That portion of the existing Warminster district which by virtue of the provisions of the Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Somerset and Wilts) Act, 1937, will on the 1st day of April, 1937, be included in the Administrative County of Somerset, shall be constituted a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Frome district.

3. The area added by Article 2 of this Order to the Frome district shall cease to be included in the Warminster sub-district and shall be added to and form part of the Frome sub-district.

4. The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Frome district, and the Registrar of Births and Deaths of the existing Frome sub-district shall respectively be the Superintendent Registrar of the Frome district and the Registrar of Births and Deaths of the Frome sub-district as extended by this Order.

## OFFENSIVE TRADES.

## SECTION 51, PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that by an order dated the 18th day of March, 1937, the Minister of Health has confirmed an order made on the 1st day of February, 1937, by the Urban District Council of Enfield in pursuance of Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring the trade or business of a rag and bone dealer within the district to be an offensive trade. In the order the expression "a rag and bone dealer" means any person who for the purpose of sale carries on upon any premises the trade of receiving, storing, sorting or manipulating any rags in an offensive condition or in a condition likely to become offensive, or any bones, rabbit skins, fat or other putrescible animal products of a like nature.
