At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 18th day of *March*, 1937.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of the Medical Act, 1886, it is provided (amongst other things) that His Majesty may, from time to time, by Order in Council, declare that the Second Part of the said Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such Order, to apply to any British Possession which in the opinion of His Majesty affords to the Registered Medical Practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British Possession as to His Majesty may seem just; and that from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British Possession shall be deemed to be a British Possession to which the said Act applies, within the meaning of the Second Part thereof, and that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British Possession the said Second Part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such Possession:

And whereas on the 9th day of May, 1892, Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council was pleased to declare that on and after the 1st day of July, 1892, the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, should be deemed to apply to India:

And whereas on the commencement of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935, Burma will cease to be part of India in accordance with the provision of sub-section (2) of

section forty-six of that Act, and the day fixed by His Majesty in Council for the commencement of the said Part III of the said Government of India Act is the 1st day of April, 1937:

And whereas from the said 1st day of April, 1937, Burma will be a British Possession within the meaning of the said Medical Act and in the opinion of His Majesty will afford to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in Burma as to His Majesty seem just:

Now, therefore, His Majesty doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and declare that, on and after the 1st day of April, 1937, the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be deemed to apply to Burma.
