

whatsoever cause be next voided, or from the date of the cessation of any yearly payment which may become charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the said William Smalley Law upon his resignation therefrom, a sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. India £3 per centum Stock (forming part of the aforesaid sum of £8,144 4s. 6d. India £3 per centum Stock) or the securities or investments from time to time representing the said sum of £6,666 13s. 4d. India £3 per centum Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thorpe Malzor and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.”

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Thorpe Malzor and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

AMENDMENT OF STATUTE.

AMENDMENT of the College Statutes duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on the 20th day of January 1937 and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University has been given on the 9th day of February 1937 (*Oxford University Gazette*, No. 2159, Vol. LXVII, page 417) and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council: Now therefore we the Principal and Fellows of the said College in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XVIII in our Statutes and Section 7 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 do order and amend the Statutes of the College by the following addition and alteration:

STATUTE II. 8.

“ The Principal shall receive in addition as an allowance to meet the expenses of enter-
