persons interested without charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on weekdays other than Saturdays and from 9.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays until the twenty-fourth day of May, 1937; (3) any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the Royal Borough of Kingston-upon-Thames or the Borough of Richmond aforesaid and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Town Council of Kingston-upon-Thames to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.
