

**METROPOLITAN POLICE COURTS
(HOLIDAYS) ACT, 1897.**

And whereas Wednesday, the 12th May, 1937, has under Section 4 of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, been duly appointed to be observed as a Bank Holiday, I do hereby order that on that day the Metropolitan Police Courts be closed in accordance with the provisions of the statute first aforementioned.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SOUTH WALES DISTRICT (COAL MINES)
SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 87 of the South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of Clause 89 of the said Scheme and of sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 29th day of April, 1937, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. In Clause 75 of the Scheme by adding a new paragraph (vii) to sub-clause (2) thereof as under:—

"(vii) The provisions of the preceding paragraphs of this sub-clause shall not apply to the share tonnages of such class or classes of coal as may be determined by the Board during any allocation periods or parts thereof between the 29th day of April, 1937 and the 30th day of September, 1937, if the Executive Board so resolves by a majority of two-thirds of the members present at the meeting, after being satisfied that the demand for coal or the said class or classes of coal is greater than the tonnages of those classes
