PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Military Manœuvres Acts, 1897 and 1911, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, authorize the execution of military manœuvres within specified limits during a specified period not exceeding three months:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the power for this purpose given to His Majesty by the said Acts, and of every other power hereunto enabling Him, doth hereby authorize the execution of military manœuvres within the limits specified in the Schedule to this Order during the period of three calendar months commencing from the 15th day of July, 1937.

And the Right Honourable Leslie Hore-Belisha, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

All those parts of the County of Kent lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, or track, is named as a boundary, such road or track:—

On the North, from Harty Ferry on the south side of the Swale eastwards along the coast to the North Foreland.

On the East, southwards along the coast to the South Foreland.

On the South, westwards along the coast to the county boundary about 5½ miles west of

Dungeness.

On the West, from this point inland along the county boundary to the point where it crosses the Rye-Tenterden road about 1½ miles north of Iden; thence northwards along this road through Wittersham to Tenterden; thence along the Tenterden-Bethersden road through High Halden to Bethersden; thence along the road by Frid Farm through Pimphurst, Lambden and Pluckley to Charing; thence along the Charing-Faversham road through Broomfield, Leaveland and Sheldwich to its junction with Watling Street at Faversham; thence westwards along Watling Street for about 1½ miles to its junction with the road which runs north-northeast through Bysing Wood to Oare; thence along this road through Oare and across the light railway to Harty Ferry.

Which area surrounded on all sides by a continuous red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.
