 TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd July, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th July, 1937, to Saturday, the 31st July, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

May it please Your Most Gracious Majesties,

The occasion of Your Majesties' visit to Cardiff, one of the principal coal shipping ports of the world, affords the deepest satisfaction to the colliery owners who are members of this Association, and who desire to extend to Your Majesties a warm welcome.

It will interest Your Majesties to know that in the South Wales coalfield there are 237 associated mines now in operation, employing 121,378 workmen. On the memorable occasion of the visit to this city of our beloved King George V and Her Gracious Majesty Queen Mary, the Association in its humble Address could claim that there were over 600 mines operating and that employment was being provided for 220,000 colliery workers.

Your Majesties are doubtless aware of the several causes and circumstances to which this adverse change is attributable and will realise the significance to South Wales of the fact that whereas in 1923 more than 30 millions of tons of its coal were sent overseas, by 1936 the amount had fallen to a little over 13 million tons.

But, in this their humble address, the colliery owners do not wish to dwell on the adversity which so long beset their industry. Rather would they humbly express to Your Majesties their profound gratification that Your Majesties' accession to the throne has synchronised with a considerable recovery in the fortunes of mining undertakings. Latterly, at home and abroad sales of coal have considerably increased, and they pray that so auspicious an opening may be prophetic of a glorious reign that will witness a full restoration of those economic activities upon which the prosperity and happiness of the people of South Wales so largely depend.

Indeed, so confident are the members of the Association that the improvement in trade which has manifested itself with increased momentum in this Your Majesties' Coronation Year is well founded, that they have recently entered into a long term agreement with the workers which ensures for them substantially higher rates of pay.

Furthermore, they would assure Your Majesties, that there exists in the industry—no less on the workmen's side than on the colliery owners'—a most earnest desire that nothing should be done which might check the expansion of trade now proceeding, and for which the waiting has been so long and patient.

New machinery for conciliating differences and speedily removing grievances has been

implemented, and we believe that Your Majesties will be pleased to know that the spirit of mutual helpfulness in which negotiations are now being pursued promises well for the future of the industry.

For many years, prior to Your Majesty's accession to the throne, Your Majesty's deep interest in and eminent services to the cause of Industrial Welfare have earned the admiration and gratitude of the Nation. It knows how profound and abiding is your anxiety that everything that can be done to ensure safety and amenities for workers shall be done. In this connection the colliery owners of this area would beg to assure Your Majesties of their desire and determination to do everything possible to protect the lives of the men engaged in what is by its nature a hazardous occupation.

They believe that Your Majesties will be interested to know of the institution of organised classes in the district to teach youths the principles and practice of safety in mines. Success has attended the inception of this work and it is being energetically extended and developed.

The members of the Association believe also that Your Majesties will welcome their decision to subscribe annually a sum of £5,000 towards the cost of maintaining a special Department at the University College of South Wales where the science of mining and cognate subjects will be taught and such research undertaken as will promote still greater technical efficiency and human well-being in the industry.

It will also afford Your Majesties pleasure and satisfaction to know that discussions are proceeding to implement the contributory pensions scheme decided upon jointly by the colliery owners and the Miners' Federation to celebrate the Jubilee of the reign of Their revered Majesties King George V. and Queen Mary.

The colliery owners most fervently hope that Your Majesties will accept their humble expressions of loyalty and their assurance that Your Majesties' presence in the South Wales Coalfield will bind yet more closely the hearts of the mining population to Your Majesties and other members of Your Royal Family.

They earnestly pray that it may please Almighty God to spare Your Majesties for many years to come, and to grant that Your rule over the peoples of your Commonwealth and Empire may be richly blessed.

THE LEE CONSERVANCY BOARD.

BYELAWS FOR REGULATING THE CONVEYANCE, LOADING AND UNLOADING OF DANGEROUS GOODS UPON THE LEE AND STORT NAVIGATIONS.

The Lee Conservancy Board in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Lee Conservancy Acts 1570-1921 and of any other authority them hereunto in anywise enabling order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. The River Lee Petrol and other Dangerous Goods Byelaws made by the Board and allowed by His Majesty in Council on the Twenty-fourth day of October 1911 so far as they relate to “Dangerous Goods” as defined by these present Byelaws shall as from the date when these present Byelaws come into operation be and the same are hereby revoked.

2. These Byelaws may be cited as “The River Lee (Dangerous Goods) Byelaws” and shall come into operation at the expiration of fourteen days after the day upon which they

have been allowed by His Majesty in Council.

3. In these Byelaws the following words and expressions shall have the several meanings hereinafter assigned to them unless there be something in the subject or text repugnant to such construction, namely:—

“The Board” means the Lee Conservancy Board.

“The Navigation” means all those parts of the Lee and Stort Navigations under the jurisdiction of the Board, that is to say, the Limehouse Cut, the Waterworks River, the City Mill River, the Three Mills Wall River, the Bow Back River, the portion of the Old River Lee from Carpenters Road Bridge to its junction with the Lee Navigation below Old Ford Locks, and the Pudding Mill River (including any Rivers widened, diverted, altered or constructed under the River Lee (Flood Relief, etc.) Act, 1930, and all parts of the Lee Navigation above Bow Locks (including those Locks) and also all parts of the Stort Navigation, the Abbey Creek, Bow Creek from the South Boundary Stones mentioned in Section 3 of the Lee Conservancy Act, 1868, to its junction with the Channelsea River, and the Channelsea River, and includes all towing paths, bridges, locks, quays, docks, basins, ponds, lay-byes, dry docks or slipways and premises connected therewith within the jurisdiction of the Board.

“Dangerous Goods” means all goods (other than Petroleum Spirit as defined in the River Lee (Petroleum Spirit and Carbide of Calcium) Byelaws, Carbide of Calcium and “Explosives” as defined by the Explosives Act, 1875) which are or may be specified from time to time in so much of the General Classification of Merchandise issued annually by the Railway Clearing House as deals with the conveyance of Dangerous Goods by Merchandise Trains and subject to the exceptions hereinbefore mentioned “Class A” and “Class B” shall have the same meanings as in that part of the said classification which deals with inflammable liquids that is to say Class A shall include any liquid or substance or any product of or mixture with any liquid or substance which, when tested in the manner set forth in Part II of the Second Schedule of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, gives off an inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than 73° Fahrenheit and Class B shall include any liquid or substance or any product of or mixture with any liquid or substance which when tested in the like manner gives off an inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than 150° Fahrenheit but not lower than 73° Fahrenheit.

“Agent” means a duly appointed officer of the Board.

“Vessel” means ship, tug, boat, barge, lighter and craft of every description.

“Owner” means and includes master, owner, consignee, consignor, broker and agent.

“Master” means the person having for the time being the command, charge or management of a vessel.

“Quay” means any quay, pier, jetty, wharf, bank or other loading or landing place or road or approaches thereto within the jurisdiction of the Board.

“Horse” shall include any draught animals.

“Tug” means a vessel propelled by steam, electricity or other mechanical power.

4. The Owner or Master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods intending to enter and/or proceed along the Navigation shall without delay give notice to the nearest Agent specifying the destination of the vessel, the quantity of Dangerous Goods on the vessel, and the manner in which such Goods are stowed, and shall not enter and/or proceed along the Navigation except with the permission of the Agent.

5. The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall during the time when such vessel is on the Navigation display by day in a conspicuous position above the deck a red flag of metal not less than 18 in. square with a white circular centre 6 in. in diameter, and by night a red light of a type approved by the Board which shall be distinctly visible in every direction at a distance of one hundred yards provided that when such a vessel is lying alongside or discharging at a quay the red light shall not be upon such vessel but red lights shall be displayed at such quay at both ends of the berth occupied by the vessel. The master of a tug towing a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall similarly exhibit a flag or light of the same description.

6.—(a) A master shall not navigate a vessel containing Dangerous Goods on the Navigation unless the name or number of the vessel and the name or initials of its owner are painted in a conspicuous position on the vessel in white letters or figures which shall as nearly as possible be 6 inches in depth.

(b) The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A), other than a self-propelled vessel, shall not navigate his vessel on the Navigation otherwise than in tow of a horse or of a tug except in an emergency or in special circumstances and then only with the approval of the Agent and subject to a limit of distance not exceeding two hundred yards.

(c) The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall not navigate his vessel through a lock with any vessel other than (i) a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A or Class B) or (ii) a tug towing such a vessel or vessels. Such tug shall, whilst being so navigated, be subject to the provisions of these Byelaws so far as applicable, as if it were a vessel containing Dangerous Goods.

(d) Subject to the provisions of these Byelaws every vessel containing Dangerous Goods shall upon entering the Navigation proceed to its destination forthwith.

(e) In the event of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods being overtaken by fog, mist, falling snow, heavy rainstorms or other exceptional causes affecting visibility the master shall not navigate such vessel on the Navigation except for such period as is necessary to enable the vessel to reach a safe mooring. Provided that nothing herein contained shall prejudice the operation of the River Lee General Byelaws or any modification thereof with respect to the mooring and passage of vessels.

7.—(a) Not more than four vessels containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall be towed together at one time and such vessels shall not be towed more than two abreast and not more

than two such vessels shall be towed in single line and no such vessel shall be towed alongside a tug. This paragraph shall apply only to Abbey Creek the Channelsea River and that portion of Bow Creek from the South Boundary Stones mentioned in Section 3 of the Lee Conservancy Act, 1868, to its junction with the Channelsea River (but not including Bow Locks).

(b) A tug shall not be permitted to tow more than two vessels containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) at a time and a self propelled vessel containing such goods shall not be permitted to tow any other vessel on the Navigation. This paragraph shall apply only to so much of the Navigation as is not subject to the provisions of the preceding paragraph.

(c) A tug whilst towing vessels containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) on the Navigation shall not be permitted to tow any other vessel, except a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class B).

8.—(a) The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A or B) shall only allow his vessel to lie or to be moored at such place as may be directed by the Agent.

(b) The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall moor his vessel in such manner that it lies singly and as far as practicable at a distance of not less than one hundred feet from any other vessel.

(c) Chain cable shall be used for anchoring or otherwise securing a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A).

Provided that this Byelaw, with the exception of paragraph (c) thereof, shall not apply to a vessel in charge of a tug when moored on account of fog mist falling snow heavy rain-storms or other exceptional causes affecting visibility or to a vessel when lying alongside a quay.

9. No person shall convey Dangerous Goods upon the Navigation in any barrel, drum, or other similar receptacle which is not staunch and free from leakage.

10.—(a) No person shall load or land Dangerous Goods (Class A) at any place on the Navigation other than such quay as the Board shall from time to time appoint or direct but the Board's approval of any quay shall not be unreasonably withheld.

(b) Except with the permission of an Agent no person shall land Dangerous Goods (Class A) until the holds of the vessel containing the same have been thoroughly ventilated.

(c) No person shall load or land Dangerous Goods (Class A) between the hours of sunset and sunrise except with the written consent of the Agent and subject to any conditions and supervision which he may direct.

(d) The master of a vessel shall not load or land Dangerous Goods (Class A) by means of the vessels' own power except under conditions approved by the Board.

(e) The owner and the master of a vessel on or from which Dangerous Goods are to be loaded or landed and the owner of such goods shall take every reasonable precaution to prevent any person within their control from smoking at or near the quay where the goods are being loaded or landed and to prevent any person engaged in such loading or landing from carrying fusees matches or any appliance whatsoever for producing ignition and the owner of the goods shall cause a " DANGER " notice

to be exhibited at the quay where the goods are being loaded or landed and to be maintained during such loading or landing in such a position that it can be seen by persons approaching the quay from any direction.

Provided that this Byelaw shall not prevent the master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods from keeping thereon a sufficient supply of safety matches in a locked metal receptacle the key of which shall be in his charge.

(f) When the loading or landing from a vessel of Dangerous Goods has been commenced the master of the vessel and the owner of the goods shall take all reasonable steps to secure that such loading or landing shall be proceeded with with due diligence.

(g) No person shall land Dangerous Goods at any quay until the means of transport by which the same are to be removed shall be at the quay in readiness to receive them; and the owner of Dangerous Goods landed at any quay shall forthwith cause them to be removed therefrom or to some safe place of storage.

(h) No person shall bring to a quay Dangerous Goods which are to be loaded into a vessel until such vessel is in readiness to receive them.

(i) The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods shall not permit iron or steel hammers or other tools capable of causing a spark to be used for the purpose of opening or closing the hatches of his vessel.

11. The master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall cause such vessel to be continuously watched by a competent person.

12. No person shall be or remain on a vessel containing Dangerous Goods except the Agent, master, owner or his authorised representative, or a person required for the navigation watching or repairing of the vessel or the loading or landing of the cargo, or an Officer in the performance of a public duty.

13. No person shall light or use fires heaters cookers and lights other than electric filament lamps and/or self contained electric lamps heaters cookers or other type of safe apparatus such lamps heaters cookers or other apparatus being so designed constructed and maintained as to be incapable of igniting inflammable vapour upon or near any quay to which a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A or B) is moored or upon or near any quay upon which such goods are lying.

14. Subject to the provisions of Byelaw 10 (E) for the keeping of safety matches in a locked metal receptacle no person on board a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall smoke or have on his person any fusees matches or other appliances whatsoever for producing ignition.

15.—(a) The owner and the master of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods shall at all times take every reasonable precaution for the prevention of accident by fire on board such vessel and the owner of such goods being loaded on or landed from a vessel shall take every reasonable precaution for the prevention of accident by fire during such loading or landing.

(b) The master of a tug towing a vessel containing Dangerous Goods (Class A) shall at all times keep on board his vessel and maintain in good working order a sufficient supply of fire extinguishers of an approved type to be carried

on deck at each end of the vessel or in other approved place or places, and in the case of a petrol driven tug towing such a vessel the master shall also keep on board an adequate supply of sand in a convenient place so as to be readily available in case of fire.

16. No person shall discharge Dangerous Goods in any part of the Navigation or allow such goods to escape in or on to any part of the Navigation and the master of a vessel conveying such goods shall not cause or permit the bilges of such vessel to be pumped until such precautions have been taken as will ensure that no Dangerous Goods can escape.

17. The owner of a vessel containing Dangerous Goods shall cause a copy of these Byelaws to be posted in a suitable and conspicuous place in such vessel and shall be responsible for having in attendance at all times a competent person to carry out and give effect to them.

18. The Master of every vessel containing Dangerous Goods shall, when so required by an Agent, show to such Agent all Dangerous Goods under his control upon the vessel and shall afford every reasonable facility to enable such Agent to inspect and examine such Dangerous Goods and such vessel so that he may ascertain whether the provisions of these Byelaws are duly observed.

19. Any person contravening any of these Byelaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) for such contravention and a further penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5) for each day for which such contravention continues and without prejudice to the right to recover such penalty it shall be lawful for the Board to cause any vessel containing Dangerous Goods which is navigated, moored, loaded, discharged or otherwise dealt with in contravention of the Byelaws or any such Dangerous Goods to be removed at the expense of the Owner thereof to some place of safety, and all expenses of or incidental to such removal may be recovered in the same manner in which penalties are by the Lee Conservancy Acts 1570-1921 made recoverable.
