Stoddart House and Shuter House into the road called Kennington Oval for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said roadway with the roadway or passage leading round the back of the building known as Shrewsbury House into the said road called Kennington Oval, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway or passage for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of the said road called Kennington Oval, and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to the middle of the last mentioned road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Ann, South Lambeth, from the said District Parish of Saint Mark, Kennington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94; of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94; and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 22nd day of July, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

words and figures following, that is to say: — "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Haverton Hill, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham: "Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 1st day of November, 1862, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Billingham, in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named 'The District of Haverton Hill':

"And whereas the said District of Haverton Hill has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Haverton Hill should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Haverton Hill shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Billingham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Haverton Hill.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Haverton Hill, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, being:—

'All that portion of the Parish of Billingham, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Haverton Hill and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Haverton Hill from the said Parish of Billingham at the junction of the footpath leading from Billingham to Haverton Hill with the footpath leading into Belasis Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the Port Clarence Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to a point due south of the junction of Belasis Lane with the bridle
