7. To empower the Company to purchase by agreement any Debentures or Debenture stock of the Company and to apply their funds for the purpose and to provide that any Debentures or Debenture stock so purchased shall be cancelled.

8. To authorise the Company to pay dividends on their Consolidated Ordinary stock in excess of the authorised rate (but not in excess of the standard rate) if a sum equal to the excess of the total amount paid in dividend on the stock over the amount which would have been payable at the authorised rate is transferred to the profit and loss (net revenue) account from the reserve fund of the Company.

9. To provide that any price charged by the Company under Section 31 of the Bedford District Gas Order 1924 or under the intended Order in excess of the price charged for a supply in the limits within which the Company are by the Bedford Gas Act 1864 as amended by the Gas Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act 1892 authorised to supply gas shall not be taken

into account in calculating the rate of dividend payable under Section 17 of the Bedford District Gas Order 1930.

10.
