

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP: FIRST AID.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 79 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, and Section 7 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, he has amended certain Regulations and Welfare Orders so far as they relate to the marking of first aid boxes and cupboards at factories, workshops, docks and premises where machinery is used for the purpose of building operations.

The Regulations and Order which are in accordance with the drafts issued on 12th February last may be cited as the First Aid Regulations, 1937, and the First Aid Welfare Order, 1937, respectively.

CUTLERY TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Cutlery Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for certain classes of male workers at present set out in their Notice C.T. (17) dated 17th August, 1937.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above-mentioned proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 17th August, 1937. Any such objection should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Cutlery Trade Board (Great Britain) Metropole Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2. It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
