The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 27th instant, to appoint the Reverend Arthur Perry to the Living of Saint Luke, Wellington, Hanley, in the County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield, void by the cession of the Reverend Charles Henry Foster.

The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Sir William Owen Wright, O.B.E., V.D., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of Chevalier of the Order of the Crown, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of the Belgians, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him while Honorary Consul of Belgium at Madras.
