MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926. REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that they have referred to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act an application for the making of an Order in Council amending Part I of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order, 1928, so as to provide that the indication of origin required by that Order to be applied to imported sanitary ware of pottery shall be applied in a prescribed position and in letters of a minimum size.

Part I of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods), No. 2 Order, 1928, renders it unlawful to import into the United Kingdom, or if imported, to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom, inter alia, any goods of the above description, unless they bear an indica-tion of origin stamped, printed, embossed or impressed on each article indelibly.
