"And whereas we are of the opinion that these arrangements should be extended to such Naval Ratings and Royal Marines who are granted leave while serving in Your Majesty's Ships and Establishments abroad:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of August, 1937, (N.5422/1937) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the rates of pay authorised under Order in Council of 3rd November, 1927, for Artificer Apprentices are progressive for each year of Apprentice training:

"And whereas we consider it necessary as a temporary measure, to enter a number of Artificer Apprentices of not less than 18 years

of age who have had not less than two and a half years' apprenticeship in civil life and to complete their training in two years, after which they will be sent to sea as Artificers 5th class:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to pay these Apprentices during their two years' training at the rates applicable, respectively, to third and fourth year Apprentices as authorised by Schedule I of Order in Council of 3rd November, 1927:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly, with effect from whatever date may be selected for the first entries of Artificer Apprentices under this scheme.

"The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas it is provided by Orders in Council of 21st December 1920, 8th December 1924 and 16th December 1925 that the rating employed as Captain's Writer in destroyers which are independent commands, in the larger submarines, and in the vessel in which the Commander of the Portland Anti-Submarine Flotilla is carried, shall be paid an allowance of 6d. a day:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that this allowance should also be payable in the West River Gunboats on the China Station:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise payment at our discretion of an allowance of 6d. a day to the Supply rating employed as Captain's Writer in the West River Gunboats on the China Station.
