

be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of October, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Eling and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Netley, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Eling and the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Netley, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Eling and of the said New Parish

of Saint Matthew, Netley, which are herein-after mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by a certain Deed of Grant bearing date on or about the 14th day of October, 1937, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856', or some or one of them, between the Reverend Robert Jack Hitchcock, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Eling, of the first part, the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, as the Patron in right of his See, and also as the Ordinary of the said Vicarage of Eling, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part, the said Robert Jack Hitchcock did, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, as such Bishop and also as such Patron as aforesaid, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners a sum of £4,183 13s. 6d. London County £3 per centum Stock and also a sum of £816 6s. 6d. India £3 per centum Stock which said sums of stock are in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Vicarage of Eling, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then towards the endowment of the Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish as from the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors:

"And whereas the said two sums of Stock have been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Robert Jack Hitchcock has nominated to us, as the persons to whom he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned, the Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester for the first turn of presentation and the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Eling for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed
