ROSS GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Ross Gas Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose registered office is at Gloucester Road, Ross-on-Wye, in the County of Hereford, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To define the limits within which the Company may supply gas to include the following areas in the county of Hereford:—

The urban district of Ross;

The parishes of Brampton Abbots, Bridstow, Ganarew, Goodrich, Hope Mansel, Llangarren, Marstow, Peterstow, Ross Rural, Walford, Welsh Bicknor, Weston-under-Penyard and Whitchurch in the rural district of Ross and Whitchurch;

to provide for the continuance maintenance and use by the Company of existing works belonging to them within the limits of supply and to apply the provisions of the Order thereto.

2. To make provision as to the breaking up of streets forming the boundary of, but outside, the limits of supply for the purpose of supplying gas to premises within those limits.

3. To define the share capital and borrowing powers of the Company and to make provision for the application of capital money.

4. To limit the rate of interest to be paid by the Company on borrowed money and the profits of the undertaking to be divided amongst the holders of the share capital of the Company and to make provision in regard to the application of profits in excess of an amount prescribed.

5. To make provision in regard to the calorific value of the gas to be supplied by the Company, the measure of therms supplied, the
